

GAMBLERS ROUTED.

JUDGE BUCKLEY SEES POOL-SELLING IS PROHIBITED BY LAW.

A "Wheel-of-Fortune" Operator Cited and the Pool-Sellers Arrested.

The overland train arrived, but no Marshal was aboard. There was a young man aboard, though, who, before the train had come to a halt, dashed off and hastened to the street. "It's all right," he said, "I'm ready, as the gamblers and attorneys gathered around him. "He's not comin' up, and ain't goin' to."

The "wheel" speedily reappeared, and one of the attorneys said, "I told you so." The pool-sellers and their attorneys were in the bar and drank Pommeys over the "victory."

Knocked out after all. The "wheel" ran until about 11:45 o'clock, when a young man rushed into the place and whispered to the operators. "Take it down, Frank is here."

The gamblers were in high glee Wednesday after. Police Judge Buckley discharged the two "chuck-a-luck" men who were arrested on the Postoffice site. They all voted him a "buck" and thought everything was clear sailing for them.

But, "there's many a slip 'twixt the cup and the lip," and the condition of affairs bears quite a different aspect now. Dan Donovan was examined in the Police Court yesterday for conducting a "wheel-of-fortune." The defense was not that he was on Government ground at the time, but that the "wheel" was a game not prohibited by law, namely, a banking or percentage game.

The gamblers thought Judge Buckley would decide in their favor. But he didn't. "The defendant in this case," said his Honor, "is charged with having conducted a banking game, as charged in the complaint, to-wit: 'What is known as the "wheel," or "wheel-of-fortune."'
