THE REPORT OF THE SECRETARY OF THE NAVY.

The report of the Secretary of the Navy, which will be transmitted to Congress to-day by the President, shows that we now have 42 ships of war, of which 11 are armored vessels, and but three of which are designed for fighting at sea.

The Secretary declares that the defense of the United States absolutely requires the creation of a fighting navy force to reduce the inequality of conditions, and he concludes:

To meet the attack of ironclads, ironclads are indispensable. To carry on an effective war with any navy, it is necessary to have a fleet of ironclads.

The Secretary does not consider the cost of a proper navy a tax upon the country, since it is but the insurance premium we should pay upon our commerce, industries and acquired wealth.

This is the most important matter treated in the report, and really absorbs the greater part of it. No Secretary has dwelt at such length upon the subject or with such force.

The Secretary refers at length to the needs of the Pacific coast, saying that some of our chief cities and centers of commerce cannot be successfully protected by any land force or construction.
