THE SACRAMENTO BALL-PLAYERS EVIDENTLY MEAN BUSINESS.

They Gain a Good Lead by Winning From Stockton, While Oakland Falls San Francisco Down.

For a time yesterday it looked as though the Stocktons were going to treat the Sacramento to a second shut-out, and for five straight innings the Senators were not allowed to score a run. In the same number of innings the visitors were permitted to tally but twice, and although matters looked more favorable for Stockton, the Sacramento did not appear to consider two runs much of an obstacle to overcome.

The first, in which Dan Brown and Stockton participated, shut a Stockton runner out at the plate, and the second one was a neat play by Godar, who hit a double, and the Sacramento appeared in their new uniforms, and the ladies all voted them beauties. They look well enough while clean, but will have to be kept in frequent contact with the wash-board if the players wish to keep them in good condition.

STATE BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

Secretary Boreck Comes to the Defense of its Members and Clerk.

Ens. RUCORD: Union. In your issue of this morning you take occasion to criticize the apparent delay in the transaction of business on the part of the Board of Examiners, and particularly on the part of S. P. Maslin, its Secretary. You do the latter a great injustice. He is faithful and painstaking in the discharge of his official duties, for which he receives \$1,800 per annum, and saves the State not less than \$15,000 each year in cutting down overcharges in claims presented for payment. I admit there is an accumulation of business on the Secretary's desk, which has been the result of the carelessness of the gentlemen employed in the Controller's office, but they, and not Mr. Maslin, are responsible for this state of affairs.

In the first biennial message of Governor Waterman, made to the Legislature, was the following recommendation: "It is respectfully recommended that your honorable body provide for the creation of a Board of Examiners, which shall have the honor of examining and approving all contracts made by any department or office of the State government, and shall have the power to investigate and report upon the management and conduct of all public officers and employees of the State, and shall have the power to remove any public officer or employee who may be found guilty of neglect of duty or of any other cause which would justify his removal from office."

THE SUPERVISORS.

An Unsuccessful Session - Overburdened Taxpayers.

Yesterday was a quiet day in the Board of Supervisors' room. Dr. Tebbets was away, and Supervisor Bates had his time largely taken up with the examination of bills. The session opened as a Board of Equalization, then some work was done in the Supervisory line, after which the business continued to alternate.

M. Fay asked for a reduction of the assessment on the Eldred House property on K street, between Tenth and Eleventh, from \$10,000 to \$2,000, the same as last year. The real estate is assessed at \$6,000 and the improvements at \$4,000, and the reduction would be \$8,000. The Board refused the request.

John Grubler asked to have the assessment of \$5,000 on the north half of lot 1, and J. Ninth and Tenth streets, reduced to \$3,000.

Mrs. C. P. Pheasant asked to have the assessment on 142 acres one mile east of the city reduced from \$200 to \$150.

J. S. Jones asked for a reduction from \$1,500 to \$1,000 on the improvements on the quarter of the north half of lot 4, in the block between Fourth and Fifth streets, L and M.

Mr. Greer objected to a couple of bills, amounting to \$100, for fees of physicians for examining insane patients. The county physician, and he thought the law should require these officials to examine all insane patients. Cases of this kind were becoming numerous, and it was too much for the people to pay regular salaries to do this, and then pay extra for examining insane patients.

Leave of absence for sixty days was granted to Justice of the Peace Clements of Galt.

A communication was read from President Gregory of the State Board of Trade, thanking the Supervisors for their action in deciding to affiliate with the former organization.

The remainder of the session was given up to the auditing of demands.

BOY AND BULLDOG. A Pair of Them Create Excitement on a Public Street.
