The Southampton Strikers Maintain a Menacing Attitude.

CHOLERA SPREADING IN SPAIN.

Army Officers Banished—The Bonapartist Cause—Three Hussars Drowned.

THE SOUTHAMPTON STRIKE.

The Troops Compelled to Make Bayonet Charges to Clear the Streets.

SOUTHAMPTON, September 10.—The striking dock laborers, sailors and firemen still maintain a menacing attitude and the authorities fear further rioting and more detachments of troops have been summoned.

Some of the strikers have gone out in boats to meet incoming steamers with the object of preventing the crews to join the strike.

Today a mob gathered about the Mayor's residence and made threatening demonstrations. The Mayor telephoned for assistance and soldiers were dispatched to disperse the crowd.

The employers held a meeting and subsequently issued handbills promising every protection to men returning to work.

The Royal Mail Company has looked out of its men and ordered its vessels to proceed to Plymouth.

THE BONAPOSTIC CAUSE.

The Duchess of Duzé one of the Financial and Back Street.

LONDON, September 10.—The revelations by the Paris papers show that the Duchess of Duzé gave six hundred thousand francs to the Bona-postic cause, but would not mix herself in the petty intrigues of the party.

Three Hussars Drowned.

BERLIN, September 10.—During the maneuvers of the German army in the district of the Prussian Saxony on the river Elbe, three of the Hussars were drowned while trying to swim their horses across the river.

Others of the Hussars narrowly escaped the same fate, and were rescued from the water with great difficulty.

The Paris correspondent of the London Times says that every day in the revolution the Hussars suffer more or less in honor excepting the Hussars of Duzé, who, without hope of realizing any return, seemed to be ready to play the part of a pecuniary Jew of Arc.
