Pulse 110 this Morning.

EXECUTIVE MANSION, Aug 16, 8:30 a. m.

The President was somewhat restless and

vomited several times during the early part

of the night. Since 3 o'clock this morning

he has not vomited, and has slept tranquilly

most of the time. Nutritious enemata are

successfully employed to sustain him. Alto-

gether the symptoms appear less urgent

than yesterday afternoon. At present his

pulse is 110; temperature, 98.6°; respira-

tion, 18.
