LONDON HAS BEEN enjoying an unusual art exhibition in the public display of the designs sent in competition for prizes in Christmas cards. Nearly 1,300 drawings are presented, exhibiting a remarkable development of skill, taste and fancy that has been very pleasing and attractive to the general public.

KALAKAUA SURPRISES the French by being unaccountably well posted upon the history of their country. In the great galleries he recognizes all the pictures of historic events, displaying great familiarity with the details of the scenes represented. His Majesty was certainly not expected to hold this forte.

OUT IN INDIANA they grow a versatile quality of Supreme Judge. He takes the law in his own hands, and when he can't close the fur shops in any other way, he sits down and breaks the bank. The heaviest game in Indianapolis was killed in this way the other day. The Judge will probably have a chance soon to "blow it in."

TOUCHING AS was the story of Mrs. Garfield's famous ride, our history now holds another of even deeper significance. A great road of commerce standing clear in road expectancy—huge workshops with their armies of workmen hushed into silence, while all along the line, with bated breath, the citizens of a great industrial nation involuntarily pause, that no waft of smoke or thrill of noise should hinder for an instant that open pathway to the sea.

WHEN SENATOR McDONALD, of Indiana, was asked his opinion about the legality of Warner Miller's election he is represented to have said:

In Kellogg's case the Republicans have established a very different principle. Kellogg was elected by a legislature which had never had in it a Senate with a quorum. The legislature, in fact, was not a legal legislature at all, for it never had a Senate. Yet Kellogg was confirmed in his seat by Republican votes.

Now, it is just possible that the Senator may have a few hurs to pick off his clothes before he has finished with this business, because his own State furnishes a precedent that conflicts with his logic. In 1857 Indiana and the Senate here, and, in fact, the Government being Democratic, that State elected Bright and Fitch to the Senate, but it was done in rather a defiant fashion by the Democrats of that Hoosier body and endorsed in rather a high-handed way by the Democrats of the National Senate. There never was any question about the validity of the Legislature which elected them, but there was no joint convention, as prescribed by law. The Senate declined to attend, and never went into convention at all. When the credentials of the new Senators were presented in Washington, Senator Butler, of South Carolina, to whom the question was referred as chairman of the Committee on Privileges and Elections, reported that they should be seated, on the ground that a majority of the Legislature was all that was needed to constitute a valid election. There was more or less of an outcry at the time when this report was made and sustained by the Senate, and Mr. McDonald had better not forget to shake up his memory a little before he opens his mouth in the question of precedent. Warner Miller will never prove an ornamental Senator to the same extent as old Jesse Bright, but, at the same time, it would seem that Democrats were somewhat debarred from heisting danger signals in his case.

THE LATEST NEWS from Long Branch, while not as cheering as could be wished, is gratifying enough to inspire hope at least. A constitution so utterly prostrated as the President's is will be sensitive to each outward impression, and each new sensation will change the action of the heart, quicken or depress the nerves, and leave its work in the variations of the pulse. The very consciousness that he was being watched by millions on his perilous ride from the dismal Mansion to the seashore, and that his path lay through anxious thousands of his countrymen, certainly was enough to disturb what little stock of nerve power he had. Then the final settlement in fresh breezy quarters would prove a disquieting elixir until the novelty had somewhat worn off. We can't expect to build up a President any more than to build Rome, in a day.

A COMMISSION of three doctors, a veterinary surgeon and a chemist have been serving as witnesses to the city of Frankfurt with the best hygienic results. They select the cows, see to their feeding and cleaning, and examine the milk. Every possible care is taken to preserve the fluid in its best condition, and it is delivered in glass vessels at the residences, where it is required for infants. The mortality among the little mortals has been notably decreased under this system of supply.
