Montgomery County Fair. The twenty-eighth annual exhibition of the Montgomery County Agricultural Society opened yesterday in the fair grounds at Rockville under favorable auspices.

The following awards were made: For best sample of wheat raised in Montgomery County, to S. T. Williams; second best, C. R. Hartshorn; best red wheat, Roger Brooke; second best, E. C. Bolt; best buckwheat, S. E. Veins; second best, R. C. Green; best rye, R. C. Green; second, T. W. Waters; best oat, T. Stabler; second best, R. R. Green; best clover seed, N. J. Wagner; best timothy seed, N. J. Wagner; second best, Charles R. Mace.

The race yesterday was for four-year-olds owned in the county, best two in three, Jessup Blair's Montie Gould won, with Robert C. Lester's Ten Broeck second and S. T. Williams' Dot third. The judges were Capt. John McDonnell, James Cashell and E. J. Bregline.

Suit for Divorce.

Jane E. Huff to-day filed her bill for a divorce from Joshua O. Huff. The parties have been residents of the District for more than twenty years, and were married Sept. 6, 1870. She charges that the defendant is a habitual drunkard and has frequently beaten her, and that living with him any longer is impossible, as she fears for her life. She charges further that in October, 1880, he kicked her on the arm and permanently disabled her wrist, and that in May, 1881, he, while in a fit of intoxication, kicked over the dinner table and demolished both crockery and eatables. That on the 21st of June, 1881, defendant assaulted plaintiff in the street in front of their residence, and tore nearly all her clothing off, and was only prevented from inflicting serious injury by the intervention of the neighbors. That on the 24th of August last he threw a tin bucket of lard at her which came near putting at end to her existence. Numerous other assaults are stated. The bill concludes with prayers for the dissolution of the bond of matrimony and an injunction against the defendant interfering with complainant or her property.

An Ex-Congressman in a Row.

Quite a lively encounter occurred last evening on the corner of Sixth and D streets, between ex-Congressman Benjamin L. Berry, of Philadelphia, and O. B. Lester, a clerk in the Patent Office. It appears that Berry had befriended Lester by getting him a position under the Government, but that Lester felt aggrieved by the foreclosure of a mortgage on certain furniture in the house of his sister-in-law, Mrs. Wadson, on the 1st of August. Mr. Berry was very badly bruised, while Lester, who is a much younger and stouter man, escaped unscathed. The case was called in the Police Court to-day, and Lester gave bonds for a continuance of the case until to-morrow.

A Delightful Excursion.

Lafayette Lodge No. 13, I. O. M., gave a splendid excursion last evening to Marshall Hall, on the steamer W. W. Corcoran. About sixty guests went. The anchors were hauled up at the arrival of the boat at the Hall, Mr. F. C. O'Neill, of the Government Printing Office, delivered an address of welcome, in which he developed much oratorical power. It was responded to by Mr. J. M. Wilson, of Baltimore. Mr. Ferbershaw on behalf of the lodge. The I. O. M. with a handsome silk flag, and Col. Ed. H. Thomas on the part of his lodge received it in his usually graceful and dignified manner. At the conclusion of the speech-making the party proceeded to indulge in the exhilarating dance, which was kept up till 12 o'clock, when they were pulled up and the merry excursionists sailed for home. It is to be hoped that this excursion will be repeated before the season is over.

The East Washington Post-office.

The wrangle about the East Washington post station continues unabated, and daily visits are made by citizens to the City Postmaster, suggesting changes. If all of the divers positions as to locality were attended to favorably there would be a post station at pretty much every corner in East Washington. The reason for the establishment of the station hangs fire at present is because there is some trouble about leasing the property which had been selected as the site.

He says he threw himself into the river because he wanted to drown himself. The man's hat, coat and shoes were found on the bank near where he was found floating. He was given dry clothes and sent to the Soldiers' Home by Lieutenant Gessford.

THE OUTRAGE ON MR. BRIGGS.

A Denial That There was Sectionalism in it.

Col. Russell, United States Marshal of Eastern Texas, is in the city at the Ebbitt House. The Colonel is a magnificent specimen of the genuine Texan physically and socially, and is one of the most estimable and highly esteemed gentlemen in that State.

Politically Col. Russell is a Republican, and as he is a native-born Texan, the Critic felt assured when it called upon him about the recently reported outrage upon young Mr. Briggs of this city, the son of the talented lady journalist, "Olive," it would secure an unbiased view bearing upon the subject, which is needed at present, as those whose judgment is warped by prejudice in denouncing the action of the cowboys seek to stamp it as a sectional matter.

Col. Russell said: "I am pained and surprised to see the effort made to convey the idea that this outrage upon young Mr. Briggs sprang from, or was originated by, any sectional feeling. There is no more cosmopolitan State in the country than is Texas. There is no State where progress stamps out all questions of politics or sectional questions than our State, and the idea that this wretched occurrence should have been brought about, as I see some of the Northern papers essay to establish, through, or from political reasons, would be absurd, were it not worse than absurd, as it is deleterious to the great interests of our State."

"How, then, Colonel, do you account for it?" "It arises from the difficulties between the cattle-men and the sheep-drovers. These quarrels and their unfortunate results are not at all infrequent. I regret to say, but they are not confined to any class of men nor to any men from any State. There is a standing ill-feeling between the cattle raisers and the sheep pasturers, the former claiming that along the ranges the sheep destroy the pasturage and cause great losses to the cattle. Trouble is always brewing between them and quarrels are often indulged in with serious consequences. It makes no difference to those engaged in the business to what section the other belongs; the bad blood shows itself, irrespective of original region or of politics."

"It seems absurd to me," continued Col. Russell, "on the part of Caldwell, who has lived and prospered in Texas for four years, to insinuate that any sectional feeling is evidenced. Where there sectional feeling it would certainly have been shown before this time, and yet this is the first intimation he gives of it. There is none. Indeed, the Northern portion of Texas is very largely settled with Northern and Western men. They form perhaps the bulk of the population. There is no State more anxious to encourage immigration than is Texas, and none where the immigrants are more heartily welcomed. Of course these unfortunate and deplorable affairs occur, such as in the case of young Mr. Briggs, but they are the same as in other States where wretched men will do wrong. They are not directed to any particular party, as for instance this is but one of the several results of the ill-feeling existing between the cattle men and sheep-raisers, and yet it is the first time that a Northern man was the victim."

Another Attachment Against Howgate.

Mr. James B. Wimer, a clerk in the office of the Signal Corps, yesterday brought suit against Capt. H. W. Howgate, claiming \$1,000 damages, and an attachment was immediately placed in the hands of the marshal against the cattle men and sheep-raisers, and yet it is the first time that a Northern man was the victim. It is unfortunate enough and wicked enough as it stands without the additional crime of attempting to fasten a sectional stigma upon it.

Honors to Gen. W. T. Sherman.

Gen. William T. Sherman, arrived at Worcester, Mass., from New London, Ct., yesterday morning, and went directly to the residence of Senator George F. Hoar, without escort. Later a parade was formed, with the Worcester City Guards, Capt. Shumway; Light Infantry, Capt. Lincoln; Worcester Agricultural Society, by whose invitation he visits the city. On the way the General dismounted to walk through the ranks of school children, who were assembled on Court Hill. As he passed they appropriately sang, "Marching through Georgia," and presented him with bouquets. While passing Plymouth Church the chimes pealed the same air, and at another point Battery B fired a salute of fifteen guns. At the fair grounds Gen. Sherman was received by the officers of the society, and was then presented to Governor Long as the guest of the Commonwealth, as well as the New England Society and the city of Worcester. Governor Long, in a few brief and well-chosen remarks, presented him to the people, who were massed around the judges' stand in enormous numbers.
