HURRAH FOR BLAINE!

YELL THE MASSES, AS HE PASSES

Over the State of Ohio and Voters of the State—The Republicans First Immense at All Points—The Progress Mr. Blaine Made Today.

MILWAUKEE, Oct. 3.—The special train of four coaches, containing Mr. Blaine and party, left the Little Miami depot at Cincinnati this morning at 9 o'clock.
