## WHERE MYSTERY REIGNS.

WHAT IS GOING ON IN VARIOUS FRATERNAL ORGANIZATIONS.

Judge Robert T. Daniel, Great Minewa of the Great Council of the Improved Order of Red Men and Great Senior Sagamore of the Great Council of Georgia.

Judge Robert T. Daniel was a charter member of Chickasaw tribe, No. 14, Improved O. R. M., says The Council. Brand, which tribe was organized in April, 1887, and was made first sachem of its tribe; he was re-elected sachem for the second term. He was elected representative to the great council of Georgia for the session of 1888. Judge Daniel at once took an active interest in the business of the United States, held at the great council of the United States, held at Chicago in Corn moon, 237, he was appointed Great Minewa, which position he still holds.

The subject of this sketch was born in Griffin, Ga., Oct. 21, 1853; was educated at Emory college, Oxford, Ga. Immediately after leaving college he began to read law, and was admitted to the bar a few months after he was 20 years old. At 22 he was elected judge of the city court, to which position he was re-elected for three terms. He retired from the bench to form a partnership with Judge John D. Stewart, the present member of Congress from the Fifth district of Georgia.

In Brunswick, in May, at the great council of Georgia, Judge Daniel was re-elected great representative for two great suns and was also elected great senior sagamore of the great council of Georgia. Judge Daniel is also a prominent Odd Fellow. He is past grand patriarch of the state and is sitting grand senior warden of the grand lodge of the state. As chairman of the committee of appeals and grievances for four years he has pronounced a number of remarkably old decisions and successfully worked out many complicated questions. Judge Daniel is one of the most prominent young men in Georgia. It is known all over the state and is doing much to build up the order in the south.

Rebekah Degree Lodges in Massachusetts.

Other Items.

There are 33 lodges of the Degree of Rebekah in the Massachusetts jurisdiction, 33 having been instituted since the August meeting. The receipts for the year have been \$2,142.20, and the amount paid for the relief of the members has been \$2,030.50.

Indiana made a gain of 1,039 for the year. California now has 322 lodges, Oregon 93 and Nevada 32.

Eleven thousand dollars have been subscribed for a new hall in Pittsburg, Pa.

The Old Fellows of New Bedford, Mass., have their \$150,000 temple nearly completed, and expect to dedicate it the 20th of April next, the anniversary of the order.

British Columbia has on an average 100 members to a lodge; Connecticut, 171; District of Columbia, 108; Maine, 140; Massachusetts, 181; New Hampshire, 150; Pennsylvania, 137; Rhode Island, 122; Pennsylvania, however, has nearly 1,000 lodges, while Ohio, the next highest, has only 673 and Illinois 600. Pennsylvania has 84,000 members; the next highest jurisdiction, Ohio, has 49,267.

The grand lodge of Massachusetts still holds two sessions a year. According to the reports the membership was increased over 400 last year.

Social Rebekah lodge, No. 10, of Manchester, N. H., has over 600 members, and is striving to reach 1,000.

Other Items.

Wicker Park lodge, No. 1907, was instituted at Chicago ten years ago. It has always been self sustaining. It has been paid \$15,000 from the windows and ornamental fund, but it has paid \$30,000.05 into that fund, or \$5,000.05 more than it has drawn out. It has paid out \$2,315.05 on account of sickness and funeral expenses, it has contributed \$700.20 to the support of the grand and supreme lodges, and now has \$1,410.71 to its credit.

Bro. O. H. Shann, of Seymour lodge, No. 115, St. Louis, Mo., is a Knight of Honor who shows his faith by his works. He was initiated into the lodge July 19, 1873. In October, 1875, he was elected financial reporter of the lodge, and has served as financial reporter ever since. During all these years he has raised but three lodge meetings. On one of these he was out of the city, and on the other two was confined to his bed by sickness.

New Jersey made a net gain of ninety-seven during the last six months.

The Daves fund has reached the sum of \$1,906.81.

Past Grand Dictator Hill of Massachusetts, is a member of the state legislature.

Alpine lodge of Manchester, N. H., has issued a neat four-page folder, giving list of officers and members, together with date of admission of each.

The Order in Missouri—Other Matters of General Interest.

Since the formation of the grand lodge of Missouri to the end of the year 1889 the total disbursements of the beneficiary fund amounted to \$2,715,300.37. The total assessments levied by Missouri in the fourteen years since the organization of the grand lodge were \$3 up to the year of 1880—the lowest being \$1 the first year (which lacked four months), and the highest being \$5 in 1888. The total beneficiary fund of the grand lodge of Missouri for the last two years, up to April 1, 1890, amounted to \$802,434.47, of which \$470,657.37 was paid during 1888 and \$331,777.10 during 1889. There were 44 deaths during the two years. Of these the average was 44 years 3.5 months; the average duration of membership 5 years 5.3 months. The longest duration of membership was 14 years 1.5 months and the shortest 2.5 months. The age of the oldest deceased was 84 years and that of the youngest 22.

The jurisdiction of Ontario has 149 lodges, Hamilton, No. 49, of Hamilton, holding the banner with 205 members, and Capital, No. 50, of Toronto, standing second with 200.

New York instituted 14 new lodges during the year 1889.

The A. O. U. W. is having a very healthy growth in Kansas City.
