FINANCES OF CITY SCHOOLS.

Receipts and Expenditures for the Year Ending July 1, '90 - More Money Expended for Schools by Wichita than by Any Other City in the State.

There is not one city in the state that has spent as much money during the year ending July 1 for schools as Wichita. This might be considered only natural and a fact known by so many that it would scarcely be necessary to state or refer to.

The expenditures have been all along the line of improvements. The demand of some time for more buildings and rooms was partly complied with in providing \$100,000 for buildings. Even this expenditure, while it will cut off many buildings being rented, will not completely wipe out the rental list.

While none of the larger buildings were ready for the last school year, all will be completed by September 8, next, the beginning of the next year. The new buildings being erected are pronounced by all to be the result of the best architectural and mechanical skill combined.

For the amount expended the showing, as estimated, could scarcely have been improved upon in any section of the city wherever buildings have been located.

The increase in pupils and improvement of the corps of teachers as well as increasing the same in numbers have also called for increase of expenditure in this line.

In response to continued improvement and increasing of facilities and number of pupils the running expenses of next school year will no doubt be greater than last. So far, however, it is thought not so much will be spent next year in buildings, if any indeed, aside from a few additions and improvements.
