Receipts of Live Stock at the Union Stock Yards during the past 24 hours—120 cattle, 1,110 hogs, and 26 mules. Shipments—26 mules. Receipts for the week 1,568 cattle, 8,854 hogs, 44 horses and 26 mules.

The cattle receipts for the week show quite a falling off from last week. There has been a good demand for good butcher grades all through, also a good inquiry for native stock steers but there has been a very limited supply of both on sale here. There is a much better feeling in the cattle trade, and prices on good stuff has advanced 20 to 40 cents. Medium grades are also firm and higher. Nearly all the desirable cattle which were at the yards today came in about 6 o'clock and was, therefore, late for the market as the buyers had all gone home. They will find a good market Monday morning. The buyers are all wanting cattle, as the supply has run very short during the past few days. The feeling was strong here at the close. Chicago market stronger. Kansas City Texans and heaves 10 cents higher. The supply was fair for closing day. About one-third of the hogs which should have arrived from the southwest about 6 o'clock did not reach the yards until 6 o'clock, and were therefore too late for today's market, and the shippers who came along with their stock were very much dissatisfied at the slow time, and seeming unnecessary delays along the road.
