ROYAL BACON NUMBERS. THE KINGS UNCROWNED, UNKNOWN AND UNHONORED. Fattest Gentlemen and Gentlest Dead-beats All Claiming Themselves - A King Who is a Walter - Genuine Blue Blood in Hard Luck - An American King.

A full list of royal and imperial pretenders would include all sorts of people in all sorts of society, from the richest and wealthiest noblemen, such as the Comte de Paris, to Orelli, the self styled king of Aracuania, who is a sort of gentle dead-beat, and Francesco, the titular king of Armenia, whose royal professor was a waiter in Milan, who in fact is in a restaurant at Versailles. As a rule nearly every king nowadays outside of the dark part of the Dark Continent has a snug sum to his credit in English or American securities, so that in the event of being put out of a job he can use the wherewithal to keep the wolf of poverty from the door.

Prince Jerome Napoleon, the leading representative of the imperial house of Bonaparte, lives in luxurious exile at Prangins, Switzerland. He has a splendid residence there, and owns among his treasures various relics of the Bonaparte family, including an Egyptian sash which the great Napoleon carried in his Italian campaigns. Prince Napoleon is wealthy and ambitious. The Bonapartes as a rule are not in good financial circumstances, and the purse of Prince Jerome is taxed to keep his friends and relatives from need.

THE REAL PRETENDERS. The ex-queen of Spain, Isabella, takes life comfortably, even luxuriously, residing in fashionable style in Paris, with occasional trips to Nice and Boulogne. Italy has a host of pretenders deprived of their crowns by the union of the Italian peninsula. Of these the house of Tuscany is the most fortunate, as the king takes care of them, and the Archduke Francis Salvator has recently married the daughter of the imperial family, the Archduchess Valerie. The heir of Bomba's crown of Naples is a quiet, harmless young man, strictly devoted to religion, and without any apparent desire to recover his dominions. Indeed the deposed Italian princes generally acquiesce in their fate, as hopeless of any change. All, without exception, are fairly well provided for.

Don Pedro, the deposed emperor of the Brazil, is the most unhappy of ex-rulers. The death of his wife was a terrible blow to him, and he languishes in the effort to go back to Brazil to die. As he has never formally renounced his claim to the crown he can fairly be called a pretender. Don Pedro is far from wealthy. While in circumstances that should dictate close economy, he is so tender hearted that he hesitates to dismiss the retainers who are eating up his substance, and consequently he grows poorer every day. It would not be surprising should the old gentleman be compelled to accept the generosity of republican Brazil.

AN AMERICAN KING. Few have heard of that enterprising and rather amusing American pretender residing in Paris, Orelli I, king of the Aracuanians, or Orelli is a Frenchman, a clear lawyer, with a taste for adventure. His travels brought him to Chili, in South America. There he made his way by accident or design to a remote section of the republic, where the Aracuanians, who are a few scattered Indians, maintained their independence. He lived among these Indians and won their good will to such a degree that the chiefs elected him king of Aracuania, and he was formally crowned with that title. As king Orelli led the Aracuanians in forays, more or less successful, against their Chilean neighbors.

When he got tired of the masquerade, which involved some peril, as the Chileans followed the new king up sharply, he started for the coast, reaching it by the way of Peru, and returned to Paris. Here he still calls himself king of Aracuania, and has instituted two or three orders of nobility, which he confers for a consideration. The validity of these orders and his right to bestow them came up not long ago before a Paris tribunal, the point at issue really being whether Orelli was a king or a swindler.

The court decided that, inasmuch as he had been accepted as king by a community which exercised independent rights and which would probably be willing to recognize him again if he could get there, he was justified in using the royal prerogative of conferring orders of nobility. Since this decision the king's honors are doubtless more than ever, and his decorations go off like buckwheat cakes and maple syrup.

A KING AS WAITER. The king of Aracuania is a good deal more fortunate than poor Francesco of Armenia, to whom I have before alluded. His full name and title is Francesco, king of Armenia, prince of Jerusalem, and hereditary guardian of the Holy Sepulcher. At present his majesty is head waiter in one of the small restaurants that dot the vicinity of Versailles. It is many years since Francesco's ancestors were driven by the Turks from the throne of Armenia, but there can be no doubt of the antiquity and purple blood of the family. Descended from a bold Crusader, they held their kingly rank for ages, until the renewed aggression of the Mohammedans and the decay of Latin power in the east made them fugitives.

Russia for a long time afforded them an asylum, and gave the titular prince a pension. But this was dropped about forty years ago, and since then the royal house of Armenia has had to take its chances with the winds. The present king is a waiter at Milan.
