AN OLD CLOTHES MART. WHERE THE CAST OFF GARMENTS OF A BIG CITY ARE SOLD. It is a Real Exchange and is Fully as Exciting a Place as Any of the Reputable Stock and Produce Exchanges of the Metropolis—Queer Dealers.

All the exchanges close early on Saturday with the exception of the Old Clothes Exchange. This does no business as all from sundown on Fridays to afternoon on Mondays, and, therefore, the closing hours on a Friday are generally unusually brisk and exciting.

A whole block on the south of Bayard street, from the Bowers down, was crowded with speculators. In front of the exchange, No. 51 Bayard, the crowd extended across the street, and it was extremely difficult to push one's way through the shouting, surging throng about its doors.

WHAT THE "DOCTOR" SAYS. The "doctor," while standing in his workshop a few days ago with his sleeves rolled up over his skinny arms, thus held forth on the subject nearest his heart: "This skeleton you see me operating on I have imported from France. You will notice the high polish on the bones, due to a method of preparation practiced only by the French. To Investigate the South Pole.
