SENATOR PEPPER ONCE MORE AIRS HIS SOCIAL VIEWS.

Two More Speeches in the Senate on the Respective Rights of Employers and Employees.

The Anti-Option Bill Again Goes Over Without Action—The House Measures to Retaliate Upon Canada Passed.

Secretary Noble Replies to Certain Charges in Reference to His Alleged Connection With the Unlawful Holding of Cattle Upon the Strip—A Fight Against the Confirmation of Shiras as Associate Justice—Capital Notes.

WASHINGTON, July 22.—The relations of capital and labor were brought to the attention of the senate today in two speeches. The first was by Mr. Peffer of Kansas, and was based on the resolution previously offered by him, instructing the judiciary committee to inquire into the subject, and to report thereon, and to see that the rights of employees to a fair rate of wages, Mr. Peffer, in his address, referred to the troubles at Homestead, and said that the employers had been guilty of working men by the power of the state in keeping their old workmen out and in bringing in new men. Troops surrounded these mills, and the workmen were sent to jail. In calling attention to these facts, he represented and spoke in the name of at least two of the greatest organizations of working men and women in the country.
