WASHINGTON, Feb. 22.—Acting Indian Commissioner Belt states that he has approved the leases for the Pawnee grazing lands, according to the statement given the rounds of the press from Guthrie.

INDIAN LEASES. The leases had been sent in according to advertisement, and could be held until congress has adjourned, and if the agreement is made, the land will be returned to the Indians, as the Indians are entitled to remuneration from them.

OSAGE LEASES. Sent in for five years, but were approved for three years, subject to legislation by congress concerning the opening of the lands to settlement.

THE BORDER BOOMERS. The lands were leased to the same parties as before at the rate of 25 cents per acre and in all the leases cover 700,000 acres.
