Mayor's Proclamation. I, H. P. Goode, acting mayor of the city of Wichita, by virtue of the power vested in me by law, do hereby make proclamation, for the public safety of the city, ordering all persons owning, keeping or harboring any dog or dogs, to muzzle the same, or confine them in a sufficient way, from and after this date, for the period of sixty (60) days.

All dogs found running at large, during the time specified, within five (5) days of the date of this proclamation, without being securely muzzled, may be killed by any officer, as the law directs.
