OF GENERAL INTEREST. There are four systems now in force for the grant of patents: 1, the American, in which the patent is granted after rigid examination into novelty; 2, the British, in which the invention is advertised and the grant is subject to opposition; 3, the German, which is a sort of compromise between the American and British, involving both an examination and an appeal to opposition; 4, the French, which involves neither an examination nor public opposition, but is a registration merely. All the patent laws of the world can be included in some of these systems, or partake of their features.—Inventive Age.
