

HONOLULU AT PEACE

President Dole Irritated by the Refusal of Foreign Diplomats to Take Part in the Anniversary Celebration—Commissioner Carter Questions Freedom of Press.

HONOLULU, Feb. 3.—In reply to President Dole's demand for an apology from the foreign diplomats, the Japanese consul, Mr. Fuji, extending the refusal to attend the anniversary government's celebration on Jan. 17.

There are indications that serious discussions may occur between the American league and the American press, and the American league has adopted resolutions affirming allegiance to the provisional government.

OREW OF THE KEARSARGE PRISONERS ON A ROOKY REEF.

Steamships Have Refused to Attempt to Rescue Them and Officers and Men are Without Water to Drink and in Great Danger of Being Washed Away.

Lieutenant Brainard is Frantic Over Their Perilous Situation.

NEW YORK, Feb. 10.—A Panama special to the World says that advices received from Colon state that the great excitement prevails there in consequence of the delay in sending help to the crew of the wrecked United States corvette Kearsarge on Roncador reef.

With the knowledge in his mind that a high wind might send the sea over the reef, and that the ship's company could not even be taken to the open sea in their splintered boats, Lieutenant Brainard became frantic when he found to his consternation that he could not instantly proceed to the rescue.
