

FIGHTS TO DO IT

WHEAT CLOSES AT THE TOP AFTER SEVERAL BREAKS.

At First It Shows Signs of Recovering, but It Becomes Weaker and Touches a Discouragingly Low Price—Then the Report of Liberal Export Clearances From New York Brings Buyers Strongly Rallied.

CHICAGO, March 13.—The wheat market was kept today within the normal range, and closed 1/4 cent higher for the top and 1/8 cent lower for the bottom.

What was most steady at yesterday's decline when the market opened. It gave some indication of a recovery in the first half hour of the session, but during the half hour succeeding that, it became weaker and touched in that time 1/4 cent lower than the lowest price it reached yesterday.

The report that over thirty boat loads had been taken for export at New York yesterday minimized by the accompanying explanation that most of it was resold by people who had previously bought it for export.

Corn was generally firm and at times quite strong. Commission houses were well supplied with orders to buy fair sized parcels.

Business was rather spasmodic, but a good volume was summed up in the course of the day. The market was fairly steady at 2 1/2 to 2 3/4 cents at the close.

Wheat receipts were 100,000 bushels, and 20,000 are looked for tomorrow. The provision market opened weak and with very little demand, and that was the feature of the trade throughout the day.
