CHICAGO, May 12.—Wheat was very weak today and after breaking the low price recorded for May, at 55 3/4, closed with the July 3 cent lower, than yesterday.

Wheat was active and very weak owing to continued liquidation, and the desire of traders to even up was responsible for the latter feeling.

The provisions were weak in sympathy with wheat, the market being with few exceptions, compared with last week.

SHOULD BE DEPOSED

BERLIN EXCITED OVER HARSH SENTENCES ON NEWSPAPER MEN.

Eight Editors Summarily Dealt With for Criticizing Police Brutality, by a German "Judge Scott," Who Disgraces the Bench—Two Kneekes in Duress for Fleeing Innocents.

BERLIN, May 12.—The summary treatment of German newspapers by high handed judges is not uncommon and generally creates but little stir, but the sentences imposed upon eight editors on May 9, has caused a decided sensation and has elicited a chorus of denunciations on all sides.

The eight editors mentioned were tried on a charge of calumny in accusing the police of brutally treating people who attended in January last, a meeting of the unemployed at Friedrichshagen.

Great dissatisfaction has also been created in legal circles at the manner in which counsel for the defense were treated by the bench.

The extreme attitude of Judge Brausewetter and the public prosecutor at Wednesday's trial appears to have brought matters to a crisis, and the public has brought before the lawyers' institute with the view of laying the case before the minister of justice.

SCANDALOUS PROCEEDINGS.

The proceedings on Wednesday were really scandalous. Judge Brausewetter upon several occasions lost his self control and bullied the defendants and their counsel in an incredible fashion.

It is impossible to describe the indignities and indignities presented in regard to the Friedrichshagen affair was decidedly in favor of the editors, who alleged that they had been misled by the statements of independent and trustworthy witnesses.

The revelations of a witness named Brand, who acted as a witness for the socialist and anarchist, created much interest and showed up in a startling manner the seamy side of the doings of Berlin judges.

Brand testified that he had been paid money to issue an inflammatory placard to the unemployed, and other evidence showed that police agents, disguised as workmen, had been employed in attacking peaceful persons as they were leaving the hall.

The legal correspondent of the National Zeitung, who acted as an agent provocateur in laying a trap for one of the witnesses, has been charged with perjury.

It is thought probable, however, that Judge Brausewetter will be removed. The consequence of the trial is that it is a disgraceful proceeding, and that it can only mean more grief to the Socialist.
