

OVER HALF KILLED

WHEAT CROP SAID TO BE IN VERY BAD SHAPE

Reports From Everywhere Show Damages - Big Area Being Plowed up in Oklahoma - Seven Townships in Cowley County Give Very Poor Returns - Kingman, Sumner, Harper, Barber, Pratt and Other Counties Report Short Crops - Harvey County Loss Fifty per Cent - Oats Also Reported in Bad Condition.

John S. Garrigus, representative of a leading agricultural paper, arrived in the city yesterday after making a personal investigation of the crops in Oklahoma and southern Kansas. He interviewed farmers and others in a position to give him correct information and from what he says wheat is in a very bad condition, particularly in the uplands.

George Hill of Mulvane, Sumner county, told him that there would not be much more than a quarter crop raised in his vicinity. S. J. Butts said that out of 200 acres he had sown he is plowing up 150 acres and thinks the remainder will not raise more than half a crop. He thought that if the entire county would raise from one-third to a half crop it would be doing well.

C. H. Raymond of Winfield said that out of an acreage of 500 acres he was compelled to plow up 300 acres. Estimates furnished him by the trustees of Mayfield, Pleasant Valley, Vernon, Cresswell, Bolton and Beaver townships of Cowley county show that from 75 to 90 per cent of wheat is doing badly in that township. These, he says, is some of the best townships in the wheat belt.

He was informed by J. W. Perry of Ingalls that 75 per cent of wheat in Payne county, O. T., was dead and by ex-United States Marshal Grimes of Kingfisher that 50 to 75 per cent of the wheat in his neighborhood shared the same fate.

B. C. Laverty, son of Dr. Laverty of Logan county, said that 90 per cent of the wheat in his vicinity was dead and that one-third of the oats had died for want of moisture.

T. Johnson of Mulhall said that out of 100 acres that he had plowed more than fifty and that he thinks 75 per cent of the wheat in his neighborhood is dead.

Dr. Hawkins of Kingman told him that 75 per cent of the wheat in his locality was dead and C. C. Roseberry of Cowley county said that he plowed up all of his 100 acre wheat field.

The following are the reports of other counties showing a similar condition prevailing: Marion county—The present condition of wheat in Marion county is very good, with a per cent of average promise of 75. About 25 per cent will be plowed up having sustained injury from cold weather. The general average condition has not improved within the last ten days.

McPherson county—An investigation of the condition of wheat in McPherson county shows that it is very bad. Not more than 40 per cent of the wheat will produce an average crop; from 40 to 55 per cent of that sown will be plowed up. The rain and snow on Monday helped its general appearance and condition.

Medicine Lodge—Wheat in Barber county is very poor. From a personal examination of one-fourth of the county there is not over a half crop.

About one-half to three-fourths of the amount sown will be plowed up unless it should soon rain. The wheat that did not get up until the warm weather the last of February, and it was so full of sap that the blizzard in March killed it.

Newton—Wheat in Harvey county is in fine condition at present with, at least, an average promise of 70 per cent. Perhaps 15 per cent of the average sown has been plowed up and the rest of the wheat was good in condition when the warm weather set in, recent rains and snow have greatly improved the condition.

Sterling—Wheat is not looking well in Rice county. It does not promise more than 40 per cent of an average crop. Probably 20 per cent will be plowed up. Conditions have improved somewhat in the last ten days.

Hutchinson—The present promise is about 75 per cent of what would be considered a good prospect for this time of the year. The present condition is good. About 15 per cent of the area sown last fall will be plowed up and put in other crops.

Winfield—The wheat of Cowley county on the uplands where the blizzard hit was almost entirely destroyed; the low land wheat will, if the weather is favorable, yield about a two-thirds crop. About three-fourths of the upland wheat is plowed up, and the lowland wheat with what is left of the upland will, if the weather is favorable, yield about one-half crop. It was thought a few days ago that the best wheat is coming out a great deal the best, that is thought to be because of its standing dry weather better than does soil wheat.

GRAINS MAKE GAINS

PROVISIONS ALSO MORE THAN HOLD THEIR OWN.

Grain Markets Dull but, Owing to Light Receipts, are Firm—Wheat Begins Where It Left Off—Outside Buying Orders Abent—Local Operators not Anxious—Corn Neglected but Upheld by Light Receipts and Wheat's Firmness—Oats Firm with Corn—Armour Buys Ribs and the Shorts Cover.

Chicago, April 10.—Owing to light receipts the grain markets, although very dull, were firm and the result of the day's trading was an advance of 1/2 cent each in wheat and corn and 1/4 cent in oats. Provisions were fairly active and higher, closing with a gain of 15 cents in pork and 2 1/2 cents each in lard and ribs.

Wheat opened quiet and steady at the point where it left off yesterday. For May 54 1/2 cents was bid and a few lots brought 1-1/2 cent over that. The general feeling during the remainder of the forenoon strengthened a little on the bullish side but there was an absence of orders from the outside and also of a desire to trade among local operators. Fluctuations were confined between 54 1/2 cents and 55 1/2 cents. The resistance to further decline was encouraged by the figures of the day's movement. July primed market receipts amounted to only 182,000 bushels compared with 312,000 bushels a year ago, and the export clearance from that date to the present has been 1,000,000 including wheat and flour. The receipts at Minneapolis and Duluth were only 174 cars compared with 250 cars on the corresponding day of last year. The Liverpool market was steady but Paris was quiet and weak. The inquiry for round lots of wheat for export and foreign shipments was renewed today but buyers and sellers' views of prices differed and none was sold. Some No. 2 spring wheat brought 5 cents May and price. The closing price for May was 55 1/2 cents.

Corn was very much neglected but was upheld by these small receipts and the firmness of wheat. Lard receipts were 73 cars and 105 cars were anticipated for tomorrow. Live-day receipts rather higher quotations, that market becoming firmer on the appointment of new freight rates for the coming crop of that country. It is now sold at 12 1/2 cents instead of a surplus of 20,000,000 or 40,000,000 bushels from the new crop that will not be to exceed 1,000,000 bushels available for export. The range of prices for May here was 45 1/2 cents and 47 1/2 cents with 45 1/2 cents the opening price and 47 1/2 cents the closing price. In oats, as in wheat and corn, few features were developed. Trading consisted principally of exchanging from May to small differences. The feeling was firm with corn. May started at 23 1/2 cents, sold up to 24 1/2 cents, down to 23 cents and closed at 23 1/2 cents. The range for the corn was 23 1/2 to 27 1/2 cents, resting at the high price. Provisions were steady early although lower prices were expected on the heavy receipts of hogs than had been expected a weaker market for them. There was considerable changing from May to more remote futures. There was a fair trade for the corn account, Armour being prominent as a seller early of May ribs. During the afternoon the market was quiet and the last hour Armour bought July and September ribs, covering and bringing in outside buying orders, thereafter closing higher. Estimated receipts for tomorrow: Wheat 11,000; corn 165 cars, oats 140 cars, hogs 21,000 head.
