

TELLER GETS BACK

REBOVIED IN DENVER IN CONQUERING HERO STYLE.

Vote for Him for Senator is Canvassed and the Result Announced—Makes a Speech to the Legislature—In an Interjunctive Roasts Sherman for an Ignoramus on Foreign Affairs, Saying the Choice is the Worst That Could Have Been Made—Formal Declaration of Senatorial Results in Other States.

Denver, Colo., Jan. 20.—United States Senator Henry M. Teller arrived in Denver this morning and spent the forenoon receiving congratulations from friends...

He reviewed the political occurrences of the past year, explained his reasons for leaving the Republican party and declared that there was no hope of securing bimaculism there had been nothing in the recent history of the Republican party to indicate that it would give the country the slightest relief in the next four years.

"If the time comes," he said, "when my conscience and yours part, no matter at what period of my term, I shall give you the opportunity to elect a man who shall stand by you."

This statement was greeted with prolonged applause and when the senator concluded the cheering continued several minutes.

In an interview this forenoon Mr. Teller severely criticized the selection of Senator Sherman for secretary of state, saying: "Sherman has absolutely no knowledge of foreign affairs and he is the most incompetent man President McKinley could have named."

MASON VERSUS ALTEGOLD. Springfield, Ill., Jan. 20.—The joint assembly today, by a strict party vote, elected W. E. Mason, of the Republican party, to succeed General John M. Palmer, of the Democratic party.

The result of the election announced, Senator Mason was elected before the legislature and made a brief address, during the course of which he declared emphatically that he favored the recognition of the belligerency of the Cuban patriots.
