CALL IS ISSUED

Republican Delegates Convention to be Held in This City.

The following call has been issued by the city Republican central committee: A delegate convention of the Republicans of the city of Wichita, will be held in Garfield hall on Thursday, the 18th day of March, 1897, commencing at 10 o'clock a. m., for the purpose of nominating candidates for the following offices, to-wit:

Mayor, city attorney, city clerk, city treasurer, three justices of the peace, and three constables, to be voted for at the election to be held in the city of Wichita, Kansas, on Tuesday, the 6th day of April, 1897. Immediately after the adjournment of said convention, the delegates from each of the various wards of the city of Wichita will meet at the same place in a separate convention for the purpose of nominating candidates for councilmen and members of the board of education from their respective wards. The basis of representation in said convention shall be one delegate for each twenty votes, or major portion thereof, cast for Hon. Chester L. Long at the election in November, 1896.

Under this apportionment the various wards are entitled to the following representation, to-wit:

- First ward 25
- Second ward 25
- Third ward 25
- Fourth ward 25
- Fifth ward 25
- Sixth ward 25

The central committee for the ensuing year shall be chosen by the delegates of the convention selecting one central committee man from each voting precinct of the different wards.

The primaries for choosing delegates for said convention shall be held on the 16th day of March, 1897, between the hours of 4 p. m. and 7 p. m., at the following places, to-wit: First ward, Martin's hardware store, on South Main street, between Douglas avenue and William street; Second ward, at 23 North Main street; Third ward, Eagle hall, on Topeka street, between First and Second; Fourth ward, corner of Oak and Lawrence; Fifth ward, Marquette block, Douglas avenue, West Side; Sixth ward, corner of 16th and Douglas.

All ballots are to be printed on plain white paper of uniform size, to be approved by the chairman, secretary and treasurer of the city central committee. All Republicans shall be entitled to vote
