STOCKS AND BONDS

YEAR'S RECORD IN VOLUME OF TRANSACTIONS IS MADE.

Dealing Well Distributed, and Long Dormant Issues Called Out by the Demand of the Outside Public, Which is Extensive—Market Breaks on Liquidation in Sugar Due to Unexpected Delay in Passing the Sugar Schedule in the Senate—Close Week at Slight Net Gains—Bonds Strong and Dealings Heavier.

New York, June 10.—Today showed the largest volume of trading in stocks during the year thus far, the total sales of all stocks being 300,000 shares. The dealings were well distributed throughout the list, many stocks that have lain dormant for a long time being called into activity by the awakened demand for securities among the outside public. This demand was also quite extensive, commission houses selling stocks pointing to the probability that the continued steady rise in prices has invited into the market some of the holdovers that have been quietly kept back for a long time. The marked strength of the market during the early portion of the day was accompanied by more or less delirious selling to take profits, but up to the final hour of trading all these offerings were absorbed without any marked effect on the market. But a heavy realization of stocks pointing to the probability that the large part of the earlier gain in most securities and all of it in quite a number.
