Indianapolis, Ind., Nov. 30.—The sixth conference of the National League began this afternoon in the assembly rooms of the Commercial club.

The purpose of the league since the organization has been formed. Its purpose is to discuss what it regards as the first essential of general municipal reform—an ideal, or model, system of government.

The committee was charged with the duty of preparing "essential principles" and a working plan or system, consistent with American industrial and political conditions.

The results of this work, which has been constant for eighteen months, are a set of general state constitution amendments and a municipal corporation act which the committee believes will accomplish all that is sought.

This morning there were many arrivals of delegates to the conference. The organization is representative of many Municipal leagues, Christian Government leagues, Good Citizenship leagues and like all over the country.

Among the delegates attending the conference are many who are distinguished as students of political economy and who are known as advocates of new systems of the prevailing conditions.

The delegates were welcomed by Governor Mount and Mayor Targart. AT THE ADVANCE MOVEMENT.

Mr. Clinton Rogers Woodruff, of Philadelphia, read his annual report, the subject of which was "The Advance Movement for Municipal Reform." He said in part:

"If one were disposed to be pessimistic concerning the municipal progress in our American cities, after a consideration of the prevailing conditions in great cities like New York, Philadelphia and Chicago, he would only have to look at the other side of the picture to be convinced that the situation is not hopeless by any means, but full of auspicious augury.
