BROUGHT BY ANOTHER SON

Case Occupies Nearly Two Days in Probate Court.

Judge Myatt returned from Topeka yesterday, having been there for two or three days attending a session of the new court of probate.

The petition prays for an order modifying the schedule of rates for the transmission of telegraph messages established by the legislature in extra session.

It is reported that the Western Union will resist the new law in the federal court in the same manner that the Kansas City Stock Yards company resisted the stock yards law.

Section 2 of the telegraph law provides: "No person, company or corporation owning or operating any telegraph line in this state shall demand, charge or receive directly or indirectly, a rate in excess of 1 cent for the first ten words, exclusive of address and one signature, and 1 cent for each additional word for transmitting any message between points within this state."

The punishment clause of the law is as follows: "Any person, company or corporation or any agent, servant or employee of any person, company or corporation violating any provision of this law shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$500 and imprisonment in the county jail of not less than thirty days nor more than one year."

Three farmers arrived at the county jail yesterday afternoon having in charge another farmer and neighbor named Henry L. Sturhan, who is insane.

Tuesday night Henry Sturhan was mentally sound and in the best of health, never having complained to his family about anything except the debt that he had assumed on purchasing the farm a few weeks ago.
