

INDIAN "HEAR WISE"

Wants No Big Reserve of Land in Kiowa County.

WHITES WOULD PEG AWAY

Until They Forced the Government to Open It.

El Reno, O. T., July 21.—Lone Wolf, a Kiowa chief, says that his people are not favorable to taking their grazing lands in large bodies to hold in common, but each Indian wants his part of the grazing land himself and adjoining his homestead allotment, and will not be satisfied with it any other way.

This being the case it is more than probable that each Indian on the reservation will be allotted 200 acres in severalty instead of 160 acres as a homestead and the 40,000 acres to be held in common for grazing purposes.

Not a single sooner or squatter was seen on the reservation. The Indians are understood to be generally satisfied with the allotment of land to them.
