COURTS AFTER HIM NOW

With Orders Compelling Him to Enroll.

Oklahoma City, O. T., May 6.—Judge J. W. Thomas, who is recognized as an authority on Indian affairs, was besieged with questions while in this city, regarding the condition of affairs near Muskogee, where he has been for some time.

Most of these Indians are full-bloods and some of them have refused to enroll before the Dawes' commission. The Creeks will have an opportunity to vote on the treaty. It comes up before the commission in a short time and only those Indians who have enrolled before the Dawes' commission previous to its ratification will be entitled to hold land under the provisions distributing the property of this tribe.

"Now, it is my impression that when the Indians who have not enrolled show the real condition of affairs that the greater portion of the delinquents will give themselves up to the privilege of taking land and property."
