

DEATH FROM HIS OWN HAND

George Sutton Shot Himself in His Brother's Store.

WORRIED OVER ACCIDENT Is the Only Reason That Has Been Assigned.

TO BE MARRIED SUNDAY Was a Man of Exemplary Habits and Many Friends.

George Sutton committed suicide early yesterday morning by shooting himself in the head in his brother's store room, at 808 East Main street.

The man's body was found in the store about half past six yesterday morning by Herman Lehmbek, who has a meat market in the same building.

The man's right arm was thrown across the body and a few inches from the head was the weapon that was used. It is a .32-caliber revolver and there were four shells in it, one of them empty.

The upper right hand side pocket, the left hip pocket and the right trousers pocket were turned around this side.
