TO KILL WORSHIPERS

Gang at Fort Scott Tear Down Stairway

LEADING TO CHAPEL

To Revenge Punishment of One of Their Number.

Fort Scott, Kan., March 5.—The band of Hellish worshipers who have hitherto been meeting at the stone church on Market street for religious worship and who have been greatly disturbed at these meetings by unruly boys and men, again report these miscreants at their old work. It is the belief of some that the cause of all this disorderly conduct is to avenge the arrest of Claude Frary, who was in justice court a short time ago to answer to the charge of disturbing religious services.

A few nights ago, during one of these meetings, a band of young men and boys who are said to be frequent visitors at this edifice, appeared on the lot outside the church and, abetted by the extreme darkness, threw a number of stones through the church building. This caused quite a little excitement among the church people and they decided to change their place of worship. From the little rock church Rev. King and his followers went to a hall on East Wall street. At the remote section of the city it was thought the previous disturbances would cease, but the idea proved to be wrong. The hall is a two-story brick structure and the upper apartments were the ones taken up by the church people. The available means of reaching the second floor is a stairway on the outside of the building in the rear. The fact that no electric lights are within a short distance of this spot, and its location, makes it an extremely dark place.

The man registered at the hotel last night as Edwin Barber, City, but a supposed friend who viewed the body at the morgue said he came from Indianapolis. It could give no reason for the suicide.

DEMAND ON THE COLONIES

Great Britain Expects to Enforce Brodick's Army Scheme Systematically. London, March 5.—The war office scheme mentioned by the war secretary, Mr. Brodick, in the house of commons yesterday evening, by which he hoped the colonial forces would soon become available in the event of a new war involving general hostilities, was today given effect today to contemplate India providing three army corps, South Africa two army corps, Australia two army corps, New Zealand one army corps and Canada four militia army corps. These in addition to six British army corps, would constitute a force for the imperial defense.

OVER MOUNTAIN RANGES

Party of Prospectors Bring Dead Friends Out of Heavy Hills. Salt Lake, Utah, March 5.—A party of prospectors reached here today, after a terrible fourteen days' journey through the snows of the timber mountain district, leaving with them the bodies of Bert Tallis, formerly a resident of Telluride, Colorado, who was killed in a snow slide at Thunder Mountain about a month ago, and those of another prospector and another named Sykes, who was victim of a snowslide also. The bodies, frozen and wrapped in hides, were drawn from the snows of the mountain, and the prospectors undergoing almost incredible hardships to bring out the bodies of their dead friends.

LARGEST IN THE WORLD

Two Immense Steamships Will be Placed Under Foreign Flags. New York, March 5.—It is reported in shipping circles, according to the Journal of Commerce, that the International of the Great Northern Steamship company (The Great Northern Railway) to place under a foreign flag its two steamers now building for the Oriental trade at the eastern ship building yards, New London, Connecticut. Much interest has naturally been caused by the report as these two steamers when completed will be the largest vessels in point of tonnage, displacement and carrying capacity in the world. They will be about 2,000 tons register and 28,000 tons load displacement to the deep-sea.

IRISH PARTY ALONE A UNIT

John Redmond Says It is Only Party Not in Row. London, March 5.—John Redmond, the chairman of the Irish Parliamentary party, in speaking tonight at an Irish league demonstration at Phoenix, Middlesex, said that the Irish party was apparently the only party in parliament today which knew its own mind and was not torn by internal dissension. He said the conference Mr. Redmond made in Mr. Salisbury, the premier, Mr. Wyndham, the chief secretary of Ireland, Lord Rosebery and Mr. Grey, M. P., was crowded with friends and hangers-on. Redmond further said that the demands of those in favor of home rule were moderate and reasonable.

MUST REMAIN NEUTRAL

Shipment of Mules for British Cannot be Stopped.

Washington, March 5.—Messrs. Wolmarans and Wessels, the Boer representatives who came to the United States from Europe for the purpose of conferring with Secretary of State Hay have achieved their purpose. They were received by Mr. Hay at 11 o'clock this morning. It was distinctly understood that the Boers were to be received as private citizens and not in an official capacity. Secretary Hay talked to them freely with this understanding. The principal objection of the delegates was to induce the United States to do something to determine the present bloody struggle in South Africa. They were not specific as to what they wanted and apparently would be satisfied with almost anything from Secretary Hay direct to a simple tender of the good offices on the part of the United States.

HE WANTED TO BE A SOLDIER

Insane Patient at St. Louis Escapes and Joins Army. St. Louis, Mo., March 5.—L. W. Loomis, an insane patient from Lincoln county, Miss., escaped from the state hospital for the insane, No. 2, in this city today, and, going to the local recruiting station, he joined the United States army. Later he was found in the street by the hospital guards who returned him to the institution. Dr. C. R. Woodson, hospital superintendent and an ophthalmologist of wide reputation, says Loomis is dangerous on the subject of war, and steps will be taken to cancel the enlistment.

PROVINCE TERRIBLY UPSET

Merong Is Being Vexated by Natives for More Peaceful Spots. Manila, March 5.—Senator Ampil, president of the town of Cantal, province of Merong, Luzon, who is well known as an American sympathizer and who has recently captured by the insurgents, together with some of the native constabulary who disappeared March 2, after an engagement with the rebels, has been rescued from his captors and returned to Cantal.

BECAUSE OF PRINCIPAL OFFICE

Council Bluffs Tax Property Belonging to Portland Mining Co. Council Bluffs, Iowa, March 5.—City Assessor Everett has included in his assessment roll the property of the Portland Mining company whose headquarters are in this city, but whose principal office is in Colorado. The Iowa Code makes a provision for taxing corporations having their principal place of business in this state. The local representative of the company refused to make a statement of its taxable property and the assessor has decided to assess the company on the basis of an estimated actual value of \$100,000 as provided by the law. The recent Burns-Boyle act for possession of a million dollars of stock in the Portland company, the assessor says, formed a basis for estimating the value of its property. The action of the city is expected to precipitate a lawsuit.


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
