

LEARNED MEN AT COLUMBIA

Leaders of Educational Work at Butler's Installation.

BISHOPS AMONG GUESTS

Roosevelt the Center of Applauding Demonstration.

BANQUET AT EVENING

President is the Guest of His Uncle's Wife.

New York, April 12.—Prof. Nicholas Murray Butler was installed as president of Columbia university with imposing ceremonies today.

President Roosevelt arrived in the city from Washington at 6:30 a. m. He was accompanied by Mrs. Roosevelt, Secretary and Mrs. Cortelyou, Surgeon General Hixson and Dr. John W. McKeen. The president went at once to the residence of his aunt, Mrs. James W. Roosevelt, where he met Dr. Butler at breakfast.

The installation proceedings proper took place in the gymnasium, to which the students of the university, the members of the faculty, the representatives of the national, state and city governments, the clergy, the alumni, the representatives of the universities and colleges, the emeriti officers and trustees marched in imposing procession.

Prominent among those on the stage were President Roosevelt, Dr. Von Holsten, the German ambassador, Lord Kelvin, Governor Odell, Bishop Potter, Rev. Morgan Dix, President Charles W. Eliot of Harvard, President Francis A. Patton of Princeton, President William B. Harper of Chicago, President Arthur S. Hadley of Yale, Monsignor County of the Catholic University of America, President J. C. Schenck of Cornell, Dr. Marvin E. Vincent of the Union Theological seminary, Chancellor McFadden of the New York university, Colonel Albert L. Mills, superintendent of the West Point military academy, President Alexander S. Webb of the College of the City of New York, President Charles F. Johnson of the Western University of Pennsylvania, President Mary E. Woolsey of the Mount Holyoke college, Bishop Henry T. Satterlee of Washington, D. C., Major General Brooks of the United States army, Governor General Taft of the Philippines, Sir Percy Anderson, the British consul general, Rear Admiral A. S. Forster, Archbishop Corrigan, Postmaster General Henry C. Payne and Secretary Richard B. Oney.

The procession to the gymnasium was most impressive. The colors of the great universities of the country, the solemn black gown offset by the crimson of Harvard, the yellow and black of Princeton, the dark blue and white of Cornell, the blue and black of Pennsylvania, blended with the colors of Oxford and Cambridge of England, and the brilliant uniforms of military and diplomatic officers formed a magnificent spectacle.

Bringing up in the rear of the great procession of learning and the most comprehensive of all, was the president, who went up from the throngs of thousands of students as the president walked along the line of march. Within easy reach of President Roosevelt and never leaving his side until he passed within the walls of Alumni hall, were four secret service men.

The formal program of the installation was opened with prayer by Dr. Vincent, William C. Sherman, on behalf of the board of trustees formerly delivered the keys of the university to the new president. As President Butler took the oath of office the great mass of students rose and the hall rang with Columbia cheers.

Dean John Howard Van Amringe delivered an address of welcome on behalf of the faculty. Dr. Fulton Cutting delivered an address on behalf of the alumni of the university.

After Deane Arnold Bradley, president of the senior class of the university, made an address of welcome on behalf of the student body. After a musical number had been rendered by the college orchestra, the next part of the long program made up of congratulatory addresses by various college presidents was begun.

The speakers were Messrs. Elliot, Hadley, Horton, Harmon, and the university President Butler made his inaugural address.

The ceremonies were closed with the singing of the national anthem, in which the president joined heartily, and by the pronouncing of the benediction by Right Rev. Bishop H. C. Fulton. At the conclusion of the exercises, the university students formed in a great square at the head of the steps leading from the gymnasium and gave their fervid cheer, ending with the cry, "Roosevelt, Roosevelt."

In response the president said: "I want to thank you all for the honor of my heart for this kind and hearty reception. I also wish to say how glad I am to see my old and valued friend made president of this great institution. Incidentally I wish to say that the cheering and enthusiasm recalls to me my school days."

The president then turned and said a brief address of thanks, entered his car and departed with his escort. He went to Mrs. James W. Roosevelt's residence.
