Topoka, Kan., July 8.—The state board of equalization held a meeting yesterday...

The reports on the valuation of real property alone shows some glaring discrepancies...

Despite the fact that Wyandotte has the largest population of any county in the state...

Shawnee has returned a total property valuation, both personal and real, of \$17,208,267.

Wyandotte county is third in the list with \$11,601,483. Valuations as returned by other large counties are as follows:

Leavenworth, \$5,697,842. Bourbon, \$5,282,646. Atchison, \$5,098,650.

Shawnee county also makes a good showing in the valuation of town lots.

Wyandotte returns a total of 69,700 town lots for taxation and values them at \$19,269,775.

Shawnee has only 49,833 town lots, but they are valued at \$5,966,354.

The number of town lots and total valuations in other large counties are as follows:

MODERN METHODS. Bonanza Farming is Attempted Near Arlington.

Hutchinson, Kan., July 8.—The Arlington Enterprise describes the outfit that has been harvesting on George White's farm, says the Bee.

George White, who lives three miles north of town, has a machine for harvesting wheat that takes the cake for anything in the way of machines in this country.

He has taken two sixteen-foot headers and attached them to a steam traction engine, also has a threshing attachment and will cut and thresh wheat at the same time.
