

MURDERER GIVEN LIFE SENTENCE

Archie Hill Found Guilty of First Degree Murder

KILLED WILL CARLTON Story of Shooting of Wichita Boy.

Archie Hill, who killed Will Carlton at Pasadena, Cal., May 31, has been found guilty of murder in the first degree and sentenced to hard labor in the penitentiary for life.

Will Carlton was the son of E. D. Carlton, who was a resident of Wichita some few years ago. The son was born in this city about twenty-five years ago and lived here until four years ago.

"When the car reached Marengo avenue Hill jumped off. The car continued its journey around the north loop and Hill met it at Worcester avenue, where he jumped aboard.

"You can give me \$4.50 now and we will be square," the colored man remarked. "Carlton denied that the colored man had any change due him, and the two men again became involved in a dispute, each insisting in the most emphatic manner that the other was in error.

DISASTROUS FIRE ON MEAD AVENUE

Home of Fred Campbell Was Totally Destroyed.

ORIGIN IS NOT KNOWN More Than \$1,000 Worth of Property Was Burned.

Fire early yesterday morning at about 4:30 o'clock totally destroyed the residence at 915 North Mead avenue, belonging to Mrs. E. E. Burke and the household goods of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Campbell, who made that place their home. The cost of the building is estimated at between \$500 and \$700. It is insured for \$100. The furniture of Mr. Campbell is insured for \$250.

At the time the fire, there was no one at home in the Campbell residence. Mrs. Campbell was away visiting friends and Mr. Campbell was at work at the power house of the Wichita Railroad and Light company, where he is employed. He was notified of the fire and hurried home, only to find that all of his household goods were destroyed. He says that he has no idea how the conflagration originated. The last time he was in the house was at 6 o'clock of the evening before. At that time he ate supper and returned to work. The burned dwelling was a four story house and in good repair. It has been owned but a short time by Mrs. Burke.

Mr. Campbell had lived in the house but about one month. At the time of his removal there, he had invested a considerable sum of money in two new carpets, a bicycle, an almost new organ and a fine sewing machine, which were among the other things destroyed by the fire.
