However, one block further down the street at the corner of Dey street it had been found necessary to open the street and build a massive wooden platform instead of the usual paving. After a few minutes work an opening was made and the laborers were helped out to safety. Through the regular opening into the subway beside St. Paul's chapel and through openings made from the cellars of the buildings adjoining the subway a flood of water was poured down on the smoldering fire, and within half an hour the blaze was extinguished and traffic on the street soon afterward resumed. Telegraph and telephone cables under the street were exposed to the fierce heat of the fire and the insulation was quickly burned off, seriously crippling all communications during the morning. **BELL IS CAUGHT.**

Tacoma, Wash., April 6.—Albert E. Bell alias James E. Butler, wanted by the governments of the United States, England and France for the crime of mail robbery, and in Kansas City for defrauding the Kansas City National bank of \$100,000, was arrested here today. He made a daring break for liberty by jumping off a sixty-foot embankment, was recaptured and finally safely landed in jail. When searched, a number of letters, all addressed to Portland, Ore., merchants from points along the Seattle and International railroad in this state and British Columbia were found in his possession, all containing checks or money orders. When closely questioned Bell stated that he and his companion had stolen a mail pouch from a truck in front of the Seattle depot last Sunday morning and had secured \$1,700 in checks and money orders, \$500 of which they had converted into cash.  
It is alleged that Bell is the same man who was captured at Denver, Colo., October 3, 1903, and who made a sensational escape from the detectives as the train was coming to a stop in the depot at Philadelphia, whether he was being taken. Under various aliases, the best known being Hammond and Crosby, he has operated from one end of the country to the other.  
It was alleged when apprehended in Denver that he had been guilty of robberies in excess of \$500,000.
