"HUNG JURY" IS NOW ANTICIPATED

No Decision Is Reached in the Stevens Case.

JURORS OUT 46 HOURS

Men Will Report at Eight This Morning.

Forty-six hours in the jury room will be the record made by the jurymen in the Stevens case before they are liberated by Judge Wilson at 8 o'clock this morning in the district court.

The case went to the jury at 11:35 o'clock Friday morning and they were not recalled until yesterday morning at 9 o'clock. At this time the foreman of the jury stated that they had not yet reached a verdict, but that there had been some change in the ballot. They were sent back to the jury room and were not recalled until 5 o'clock in the evening. When they were brought in again Judge Wilson asked the foreman if they had reached a verdict. He replied that they had not and said he did not think they would.

"Has there been any change in the ballot since you were in this morning?" asked the judge.

"Yes, sir," replied Mr. Bulkley, the foreman of the jury. "There has been some change, but I think we are farther apart than before."

"Gentlemen, you may return to the jury room, and if you reach a verdict by 7:30 o'clock this evening you may call me up by phone and I will come down. If you do not reach a verdict by that time I will see you in the morning."

The jury then filed back into the jury room, where they were still confined at an early hour this morning.

The jurymen in the case are: F. R. Smith, Frank Davis, John True, H. E. Griffen, V. J. Basore, J. L. Stuckey, W. T. Bulkley, A. L. Fuller, J. M. Humphrey, John Smith, Henry Johnson and J. H. Herman.

No verdict other than "hung jury" is now anticipated.

In that section of the country there has not been any rainfall since last June, which makes it very dry. WANTS NEW TRIAL.

Greeley Robinson Files Petition by His Attorney.

Greeley Robinson, colored, by his attorney, Judge J. C. Milton, filed a petition for a new trial yesterday morning in the district court. He was convicted last week of attempted manslaughter in the first degree.

The grounds stated in the motion for the new trial are as follows:

First, That the court erred in admitting testimony in support of the first defendant.

Second, That the court permitted evidence to the jury to the prejudice of the defendant.

Third, That the information was void on account of a misjoinder of causes of action.

Fourth, That the court admitted illegal testimony.

Fifth, That the court misdirected the jury in the material matters of law.

Sixth, That the verdict was contrary to law.

Seventh, That the verdict was contrary to and not sustained by the evidence.


