### REMINISCENCES OF HONOLULU.

LVI.

Previous to the year 1857 there had been some talk in the newspapers here about the tenets of the religious sect known as Unitarians, of which it appeared there was somewhat of a following, and probably it still is in the Islands. The Athens of American-Boston—was the headquarters of the American Unitarian Association. The Rev. J. C. Smith, a clergyman that denomination at Newton Corners, Mass., having been obliged to resign his pastoral account of ill health, and it being thought that a sea voyage might be beneficial, he was commissioned by the above named Association to visit Honolulu, with a view to establish a Unitarian Church here. But on his arrival the disease (consumption) progressed so rapidly that he was unable to enter upon his work, and on the 29th of December, six weeks after landing, he died.

On the last day but one of the year 1857, there occurred a real case of flooding in Honolulu—or rather at Waikiki. There had, in former years, been instances of log-rafts, gotten up for the purpose of fooling some shallow pate. But this one was the genuine article, principals and seconds being in dead earnest. Most of the parties concerned have passed "over the river" now. As fortunately nobody was hurt, honor fully satisfied and the stain of dire insults washed out in nothing more sanguine than claret—perhaps a certain medical gentleman now residing in Honolulu, who acted as surgeon on the occasion, may be inclined to gratify the curiosity of those who desire further particulars of the one real duel in Honolulu.

January 4, 1858, occurred the general election for Representatives throughout the Islands. In this city, for the first time since the adoption of universal suffrage, a spirit of party was manifested, there being two tickets, one designated as "the government," and the other as "independent." On the former were—Hon. John H. one of the Judges of the Supreme Court; Wm. Webster, the King's Land Agent; J. W. E. Makai, Adjutant General of the Troops; and R. G. Davies. (The latter gentleman, save for the company he was in, could hardly be considered a government partisan.) The fight was a lively one, 2,117 votes were polled, and the "independents" elected their men by an average majority of 132 votes. This were—J. I. Dowsett, Paul F. Manini, John Hammond, and I. Kahai.

On the other Islands also, the elections were generally pretty closely contested, though the distinction between government men and independents was not so closely defined as in the metropolis. The following were the members elected: Hawaii—H. L. Sheldon, J. W. Kapahe, S. Laani, Lainaohu, S. Kipi, D. H. Hitchcock, John S. Low, G. M. Robertson, Maui—J. W. Austin, Z. P. Kaunana, M. Ke-nui, John Richardson, M. Kapihe, C. K. Kani, Molekai and Lanai—J. W. B. Kioela, E. K. Kamailekane. Oahu—J. I. Dowsett, I. Kahai, P. F. Manini, John Hammond, G. P. Judd, J. W. Kalanipou, R. H. Kaauka, S. P. Kalama. Kauai—J. S. Hollister, J. E. Chamberlain, D. Nuihewa.

January 10, died Paul C. Dacoron Esq., a prominent member of the Bar of the Supreme Court. He had only resided here some two years, but by his honesty and integrity as well as his ability as a counselor, he had made many friends. He was a native of London, England, but came here with his family from the Colonies, and died at the early age of 35 years.

Henry St. John, who for many years had filled the office of Purveyor to Kamehameha III and IV, died Jan. 13, aged 37. He was an Englishman, an accomplished artist in the culinary line, but unfortunately a hard drinker, in the indulgence of which last named habit he had great facilities as the King's butler, and in which he fell a victim.
