The Pacific Engineering Company was the lowest bidder for erecting a four-story concrete building on the old Fullein office site for the Brewer Estate, Ltd. The bid was \$33,300, with an alternate bid of \$36,250, time in each being 225 days. Ripley & Reynolds are the architects.

Following the objection of the Inter-Island steamship company to the proposed demolition of the old Kinau wharf, the board of harbor commissioners yesterday afternoon decided to authorize plans for a new one to take its place. The old wharf will be razed, the board deciding it has outlived its usefulness.

The public no longer will be permitted to occupy the Territory's wharves during celebrations while large cargoes of goods are lying on the docks. This decision was reached yesterday by the board of harbor commissioners following a complaint by the harbor master and the collector of customs.

Samuel Hall a former well known citizen of Kona, died last night at the home of Farm Corn, at Punahou, from a stroke of paralysis, with which he had been afflicted for several months. He was 56 years old, and leaves four children, a daughter residing in Honolulu and three sons on Hawaii. The funeral takes place this afternoon from Silva's undertaking parlors.

The Hawaiian Engineering Association will hold its regular meeting in the auditorium of the McKinley High School at 8 o'clock tonight. E. Kopke of the Honolulu Iron Works will read a paper on "Clarification" and J. N. S. Williams of the Kahuili railroad has prepared a paper on the "Handling of Waste Molasses." Both papers, it is stated, have an important bearing on the leading industry of the islands.

Tenders for the new Territorial bonds will be called for August 15, according to a communication received yesterday afternoon by Governor Peary from Treasurer Conkling. Certified copies of the documents used in connection with the issue, together with the papers containing the President's signature of approval and Secretary of the Treasury MacVeagh's acceptance of the bonds on the law standard arrived in the day's mail.

San Francisco, Cal., July 10.—Uncle Sam has joined hands with the best friends of this city and has refused to recognize "Frisco" as a substitute for "San Francisco." Incidentally the unforfeitable distortion of the city's name has cost somebody a neat sum of money and a number of transportation companies a lot of inconvenience.

Railroad cars containing goods shipped from here in bond are sealed by the customs authorities. Lead seals were used until the first of this month, when the government officially adopted a tin seal. This seal locks automatically and the regulation making its use compulsory provided that the seals should bear the name of the city stamped in the tin. These seals are provided by the transportation companies and were made in the east.

When the new seals arrived it was found that all but those shipped to the Southern Pacific had been stamped "Frisco." Collector Stratton refused to recognize this as the name of this port and his ruling has been confirmed by Washington. The blame for the mistake was placed on the manufacturer.

As the old lead seals have been legislated out of use and as the government will not recognize the tin ones marked "Frisco" as complying with the law, the Western Pacific, Santa Fe, Pacific Mail, San Francisco and Portland and Pacific Coast Steamship companies are handling bonded freight only through the courtesy of the Southern Pacific, which has loaned the others enough of the approved seals to go on with until they can replace the tin labels on the name of San Francisco with seals that conform with the law.
