MURRAY DECIDES TO WITHDRAW NOW

Candidate for Supervisor Gives Reasons for Quitting Race

Supervisor Harry Murray has sent to the Star-Bulletin the following communication with the request that it be published in announcement and explanation of his withdrawal from the campaign for re-election to the board: Honolulu, T. H., August 26, 1912. To the Electorate of the City and County and More Especially to the Voters of the Republican Party: I am not now, nor will I become a candidate at the approaching election for any office. This announcement is made largely for the protection of my political and personal friends who are being harassed by the small element lately assuming dictation to the body of the Republican party. Within the past few days there has been a most insistent and vicious detailed attack upon men, who were likely to be members of the county convention and who were favorable to my renomination. Those who have confidence in me would be in the majority in that body and should I desire I could again go before the people and campaign to victory. But the wrath of the coterie of the "inner circle" would descend upon my supporters, with serious consequences to many of them. Until December 30, 1912, I shall continue to be a member of the board of supervisors of the city and county of Honolulu. During this brief period I shall strive to add to the record of economical and progressive accomplishment begun January, 1911. I have striven sincerely and fairly to do things for the betterment of Honolulu and her people. If I have created opposition and envy I have done so in a good cause. I thank most sincerely my many loyal friends for their support and sound advice, for the co-operation in the upbuilding of the town in which I have spent nearly all the years of my life and for which, as a private citizen, I shall always be willing to humbly give the best that is in me. They departed again for Honolulu Tuesday via Lahaina. "I deny that I have a son." He explained with heat that he had promised a trip to Maui to one of his numerous proteges and that suspicion of double-dealing in family affairs is very unjust.

Suit for the condemnation of the tract at Palama desired as a site for the proposed new prison was filed in the Circuit Court yesterday afternoon by the attorney general. The tract, containing about nine and three-quarter acres, is owned now by Elizabeth K. Meyer, with several other persons having slight interests in the property. A small outbreak of typhoid fever, thought to have started from a case last June, has occurred at the Waianalo plantation camps at the southern end of the island. Four cases have been reported in a white family at that place. No serious outbreak of the contagion is anticipated, however, and the present cases are being handled satisfactorily by the officials working under the board of health. As a result of an attempt to take the local police station by storm last night, J. Kamewa was locked up on a charge of assault with a deadly weapon. Y. Harana, a hack driver, was the complainant. According to Harana, when he asked Kamewa for his fare the Japanese drew a revolver and opened fire, the bullets missing the hack but hitting the police station and breaking up a checker game in progress in the detective bureau. Kamewa's arrest followed.

POET RILEY MAKES BIG GIFT TO HIS NEPHEW

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Aug. 12.—James Whitcomb Riley, the Hoosier poet, has deposited a check for \$50,000 with the Union Trust Company of this city in favor of Edmund H. Eitel, his nephew, who married in this city three days ago. The gift is not regarded specially as a bridal present, but goes to the young man as an evidence of the appreciation of the donor for several years of faithful service and advice as Mr. Riley's private secretary. Eitel has proved a valuable adviser to the poet in the latter's investments in this city and elsewhere, and, in a sense, has acted as his banker, for which Mr. Riley thus shows his gratitude.
