**ALGAROBA MILL SITE OBTAINED**

Honolulu Gains Another Factory and a Brand New Industry

President W. H. Hoogs, of the Algaroba Feed Company, Ltd., has secured a site for the company's mill. It is at the corner of Queen street and Iwilei road.

"The mill will be equipped with the largest sized crusher, having a capacity of eight tons of crushed beans a day," said Mr. Hoogs to a Star-Bulletin reporter. "Being alongside the railroad we can handle our raw material and the output of the mill in a satisfactory way. A warehouse to carry about six thousand tons will be erected."

"We are swamped with orders for the feed and if the business increases as it promises, we will have to put up three or four more mills in the near future. The demand is not surprising when it is considered that the hard kernels of the pods contain over nine per cent of protein and about twelve per cent of sugar."

With Mr. Hoogs as president, the other officers of the company are: Lee St. John Gilbert, vice-president; Oswald St. John Gilbert, treasurer; W. Dulsenberg, secretary, and T. J. King, auditor. The president, vice-president and treasurer own most of the capital stock of \$24,000, the other officers having one share each, and the capital represents the shares of the Renewer Company, bought for \$20,000, and the patent rights of the Renewer machine in Mexico, bought for \$4,000. Charles W. Renewer invented the crusher that is the basis of this promising new industry, which seems destined to turn the enormous crop of algaroba tree beans into a valuable staple of animal feed. As the tree grows luxuriantly in all sorts of soil throughout the islands, spreading naturally without planting or cultivation, it would be hard to set a limit on the supply of raw material. Until now the beans have been gathered here and there haphazard fashion by owners of stock and fed in the raw. By crushing, their value is greatly increased.

**PINEAPPLES GIVE NEW ODOR TO COURTROOM**

Pineapples, fresh and canned, strewn the floor of the police court-room this morning in such abundance that the resulting aroma reminded the on-looker of a cannery and drowned the familiar odors for which the local police court is famous.

Three men, a Chinese, a Japanese, and a Hawaiian were arraigned this morning with the evidence; Ah Sing and Homa being charged with receiving stolen property alleged to have been taken from the Thomas Pineapple Cannery, Ltd., at Kailahi by William Kalima, a Hawaiian, arrested and charged with larceny in the second degree.

Owing to the fact that the evidence would spoil, if allowed to lie in the evidence room of the police station, cognizance was taken of the submitted evidence and it was turned over to the complaining witnesses and the cases of the three prisoners were continued until August 30.
