REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE DISCHARGE OF NITRATE OF SODA, SULPHUR AND OTHER SIMILAR MATERIALS UPON THE WHARVES OF THE TERRITORY OF HAWAII, AS AMENDED AUGUST 28, 1912.
21. No nitrate of soda, sulphur, or other similar materials shall be stored, awaiting transportation, upon any wharf within the Territory of Hawaii, unless the same be packed in sound and non-leaky containers. All nitrate of soda, sulphur or other similar materials so stored shall, at the expense of the consignee, be under the continuous care of a competent watchman until removed.
Masters, owners and consignees of nitrate of soda cargoes, sulphur or other similar materials must keep the wharf at all times swept clean and free of any loose nitrate of soda, sulphur or other similar materials during the entire process of unloading and removing the cargo. No loose nitrate of soda, sulphur or other similar materials will be permitted to be landed. In all cases nitrate of soda, sulphur or other similar materials must be landed from ships in sound containers. During the process of discharging or removing said cargoes, it shall be obligatory on the part of the ship or agents of said vessel, to provide water containers of not less than fifty (50) gallons each at intervals of not less than fifty (50) feet apart with suitable buckets placed alongside each container; said containers to be filled with a solution of water and nitrate of soda to be used in the case of fire. Any person or persons who shall violate the above Regulation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to the penalties as provided by Section 9, Act 163 of the Session Laws of 1911.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE DISCHARGE OF NITRATE OF SODA, SULPHUR AND OTHER SIMILAR MATERIALS UPON THE WHARVES OF THE TERRITORY OF HAWAII, AS AMENDED AUGUST 28, 1912.

21. No nitrate of soda, sulphur, or other similar materials shall be stored, awaiting transportation, upon any wharf within the Territory of Hawaii, unless the same be packed in sound and non-leaky containers. All nitrate of soda, sulphur or other similar materials so stored shall, at the expense of the consignee, be under the continuous care of a competent watchman until removed.

Masters, owners and consignees of nitrate of soda cargoes, sulphur or other similar materials must keep the wharf at all times swept clean and free of any loose nitrate of soda, sulphur or other similar materials during the entire process of unloading and removing the cargo. No loose nitrate of soda, sulphur or other similar materials will be permitted to be landed. In all cases nitrate of soda, sulphur or other similar materials must be landed from ships in sound containers. During the process of discharging or removing said cargoes, it shall be obligatory on the part of the ship or agents of said vessel, to provide water containers of not less than fifty (50) gallons each at intervals of not less than fifty (50) feet apart with suitable buckets placed alongside each container; said containers to be filled with a solution of water and nitrate of soda to be used in the case of fire. PHILIPPINE SUGAR LANDS IN DEMAND
Manila Cables American: The bureau of lands reports an ever increasing demand for information regarding sugar and copra lands from people in the United States. The bureau now averages about five or six of the letters every day and it is only within the last year that these inquiries have been coming in to any extent, showing that the people at home are beginning to hear the right kind of reports on the Philippine Islands.
Most of the writers request information regarding sugar and copra lands; hemp and rubber inquiries are scarce. After providing all the information possible the bureau turns the letters over to the local merchants and real estate men in the hope that they may be able to interest the writers and get in touch with home capital already interested in the Philippines.
In speaking of land for sugar growing yesterday a prominent land official told a Cablesnews American reporter that he could not understand why there were not more people in the sugar business here. It was suggested that perhaps the difficulty in securing suitable tracts of land large enough to make the business pay was the cause. The official replied, "While it is true that a corporation or individual cannot get enough government land for this purpose there is no reason why a private individual cannot go out almost any place in the provinces and buy from the owners land suitable to his need at a nominal price. He could start on a small scale and increase his holdings from time to time. When he had his land under cultivation and producing, and a mill started, the owners of the surrounding tracts would see the advisability of either raising sugar themselves and selling to the bigger man or sell their land outright. It would not take them long to see that this would be much more profitable than raising varied and uncertain crops as most of them do now. In this way a live man could, in a few years, have a holding in a business that would make him rich. I wish I had the capital and opportunity to go into this myself."

TAFT OUTLOOK BRIGHTENING
WASHINGTON, August 29.—Chairman Hillis of the Republican National Committee was in Washington today to meet the Republican members of Congress from the various States and get a line on the situation in their respective zones. There was nothing sensational about the conference. It had been reported that the national chairman was coming to the capital to make the Representatives declare their stand on the Presidential issue. Every move of the campaign manager is given a sensational turn by the sensation-mongers. In this case, Hillis came to meet and talk with the supporters of the Republican ticket before the members of Congress scatter to their districts on the adjournment of Congress.
Five Republicans, who have been classed with the dyed-in-the-wool Progressives, joined the regulars who met the chairman in the headquarters of the Republican Congressional campaign committee. They were La Follette of Washington, Kendall, Wood and Haughen of Iowa and Rees of Kansas.
Hillis Hears Good News.
During the day Hillis also had a long conference with President Taft, and tonight he planned campaign affairs with Senator Crane of Massachusetts and others, who will take a leading part in the fight in behalf of the President. Incident to the chairman's visit, it was announced that George R. Sheldon again will serve as treasurer of the Republican National Committee.
Hillis is feeling more optimistic as a result of his observations in New York and Chicago since he took up the campaign work than are many Republicans who have viewed the situation merely from the Washington end. Everybody admits that the early signs have been favorable to Wilson, but those who feel the pulse of the voters where voters live have been pledging their faith to a change of sentiment before the November election. Mr. Hillis told those who met him that he was particularly encouraged by the things he heard during his recent visit to Chicago. The Illinois leaders, he declared, feel certain of carrying that State.
Hard Fight in Kansas.
It was made known today that the fight in Kansas will be carried to the last ditch. It was asserted that the leaders of the Bull Moose movement in the Sunflower State are getting "cold feet" with respect to the forcing of the Roosevelt Electors upon the regular Republican ticket. Whereas, it was indicated a short time ago that Kansas had been practically abandoned by the Taft forces, it now appears that an effort will be made to carry the State for the President. Last night the Taftites won their point for an injunction to prevent county clerks from placing the names of Roosevelt Electors on the Republican ticket. It is predicted that the Supreme Court of the State will refuse to take jurisdiction of the contest between the factions on the ground that political parties are voluntary organizations and that the national governing board is all powerful in settling intra-party disputes.
