SCIENCE MAY CURE CRIMINAL TENDENCIES

Prison Wardens Considering Sweeping Reforms

MATTEAWAN, N. Y., Sept. 10. — A meeting of the state prison wardens, called here today for the purpose of considering medical treatment for prisoners as soon as they are received, may result in sweeping penal reforms if the wardens act favorably on the medical testimony to be presented. It is the first official step taken in this state along the lines proposed by the American Prison Reform association at its meeting in Omaha.

The proposed reforms are based on observations of criminals in different penal institutions of the country, by which it is shown that most crimes committed are the direct result of incompetency arising from physical as well as mental defects in the criminal. The remedy, to consider which this meeting is called, is the medical inspection of all prisoners and the correcting of all such crime-inducing ailments while the subjects are serving terms, so that on being set at liberty the causes of criminality will no longer be present to lead to a recurrence.

This was the plan adopted by the American Prison Reform association and upon which some of the middle western states have already acted.
