"Some of the persons now posing as Third Party men will wake up after the election and find they live alone. We would be glad to welcome them back to the Republican party, but they must come back as whole Republicans. They must support the national, State and local tickets."

That was the substance of President Taft's message to the Republican Club of Beverly. The President continued by advising against a policy of temporizing.

Governor Hiram W. Johnson of California invaded Governor Wilson's home State last night and in a speech in Newark attacked the Democratic presidential candidate on his attitude toward the New York Democratic State situation, termed his tariff argument indefinite, declared he had failed in his recent efforts to explain his position on the recall of judges, and said he offered no solution for the question of social and industrial justice.

Mrs. Agnes Smith-Shanley, the divorced wife of F. P. Shanley, proprietor of the International Hotel of this city, returned to San Francisco on the steamship Korea from Honolulu to get the final decree that will leave her free to wed again. When Mrs. Shanley gets the decree, she will return to Honolulu and become the bride of James K. Parker, son of Colonel Sam Parker.

The armies of the Balkan Mountain States are preparing for war with undiminished activity. The mobilization order given out yesterday is being put into effect with all speed. The various nations concerned seem to believe that the long-looked-for moment has at last arrived when they will be called upon to march against Turkey.

"If Governor Woodrow Wilson is elected President, would you accept, if offered, a position in his cabinet?" was asked Colonel William Jennings Bryan today by a reporter. "I consider that question impertinent," returned the Colonel.

The well-informed among New York baseball fans are counting on "Rube" Marquard as a probable heavy factor in the pitching department of the New York National League Club for the world's series with the Boston of the American League.

This was moving day for Governor Woodrow Wilson, officially, political and personally. He formally moved to the State White House from the summer capital in Seagriff. His family also moved their belongings from Seagriff to Princeton.

The bubonic plague has broken out on the ship Belle Isle, which trades between Newcastle and Hamburg, Germany, and which is lying by a wharf in Newcastle. One apprentice is dead, and two others of the crew are afflicted.

It is rumored that General Bagabo and his entire staff had been captured in the North just west of the line of the Mexican Northwestern railroad and all executed. No confirmation was possible in government offices.

Captain C. Sydney Haight, Fifth Cavalry, has been granted leave of absence for three months with permission to apply for an extension of another month.

Lieutenant Donald P. Morrison was killed and eight men injured today by the explosion of the steam chest on the torpedo boat destroyer Walker.
