BY AUTHORITY.

The Board of Supervisors will hold a meeting in the Assembly hall, Metropolitan Building, corner of King and Fort Streets, at 7:30 o'clock p. m., Thursday, October 24, 1912, at which discussions are invited on Bill No. 51, same being Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 11 so that Section 13 will read as follows:

Section 13. No person riding, driving, propelling, or in charge of any vehicle upon any street, shall allow such vehicle to remain backed up to the curb, except when such vehicle is being actually loaded or unloaded, except as hereinafter provided. No person riding, driving, propelling, or in charge of any vehicle, shall allow such vehicle to stand or remain on Fort Street, between Queen Street and Beretania Street, in the district of Honolulu, for any longer time than is necessary to allow passengers to enter such vehicle or to alight therefrom, or longer than is necessary for the loading or unloading of the same.

GREEKS RETURNING TO FIGHT TURKS

SAN FRANCISCO, October 23.—There was an exodus of Greeks from San Francisco and the nearby cities today, when 250 young men of this nationality started for Greece to join the armies at the front fighting against the Turks. There was great enthusiasm manifested by the would-be soldiers.

Over-Night FEDERAL Wireless To the Advertiser

A London dispatch from Paris, France, to London contains the following account of the opening of the Balkan war:

"When the Sultan of Turkey gave orders for army mobilization, he sent to the Czar of Bulgaria a sack of millet, with the following letter:

"Ferdinand Efendi: Mobilize if you like, but be assured that there are as many soldiers in Turkey as there are grains of millet in this sack. Now, if you wish, declare war."

"The Czar's reply was in kind. He sent a very much smaller sack filled with tiny grains of a most virulent red pepper of the country. With it was the following dedication:

"Dear Sultan: The Bulgarians are not numerous, it is true, but be assured that to stick your nose into their affairs is like sticking it into our national product. Try and see. They'll sting you so sharply that the whole of Asia will not be able to save you."

President Taft's plan for cooperative banks for the United States farmer has been endorsed by many Governors. Ten letters from State executives, discussing the plan, have been received at Beverley. The Governors who approved the President's idea are:

Eberhardt of Minnesota. Pothier of Rhode Island. Foss of Massachusetts. Vessey of South Dakota. Bleasoe of South Carolina. Goldsborough of Maryland, and Mann of Virginia.

"Not a single person, save the confessed murderer, 'Bald Jack' Rose, has ever connected Police Lieutenant Charles E. Becker with these gunmen—Jack Rose, the hell of assassins, the hell of robbers who kill men."

In these words, John F. McIntyre, chief counsel for Police Lieutenant Charles E. Becker, on trial for the murder of Herman Rosenthal, the gambler, today sounded the keynote of an appeal to the jurors to acquit his client of the murder.

Governor Wilson's trust record was the object of attack by Governor Hiram W. Johnson of California, in a speech at Trenton, New Jersey, last night. The Vice-Presidential candidate on the Progressive party ticket described the growth of industrial combinations, and declared that when they became a real menace to this government that it was President Roosevelt who made the fight for trust regulation.

In line with the contentions of the defense, that only the McNamara and Orle E. McManis were responsible for explosions, Miss Mary C. Dye testified in the "dynamite conspiracy" trial today that Frank M. Ryan and other officials of the International Iron and Bridge Workers' Union were in headquarters when jobs were being blown up.

Queen Wilhelmina has been suffering several days from a slight indisposition. This, according to an official bulletin, tends to dispel hope which Her Majesty entertained of the birth of an heir to the throne. The bulletin adds that the condition of the Queen is otherwise satisfactory.

The Greek army defeated the Turkish troops this morning beyond Elazone, after a fierce battle. Turks are now retreating to the town of Servia, according to a dispatch received here from Crown Prince Constantine of Greece, commander-in-chief of the Greek army. Three forts were captured.

A long night's sleep largely offset the wearisome efforts of Colonel Roosevelt's trip from Chicago to Oyster Bay, and he was greatly refreshed when he awoke this morning. He at once declared that he was hungry, and his breakfast was prepared an hour before the usual time.

Jack Johnson's Cafe de Champion in Chicago is to be closed. The world's champion fighter is to be elected from the saloon business, that he boasts nets him \$50,000 annually, just as soon as Mayor Carter H. Harrison can find a legal method of bringing about this result.
