## Siberia at Noon Tomorrow.

The Pacific Mail liner Siberia from San Francisco enroute to the Coast of Asia by the way of Honolulu should arrive at quarantine on or about noon tomorrow with one hundred tons cargo for discharge at this port. The Siberia has eight-five passengers who will leave the vessel at Honolulu. The vessel is to be supplied with about four hundred tons coal during the stay here, and the hour of sailing for Japan and China ports has not been determined by H. Hackfeld & Company, the agents for the vessel.

From the delay in the arrival of the vessel, the inference is gained that the Siberia is meeting with some rough weather in nearing the islands.

## Promise Goes into Quarantine.

To rid the Norwegian freighter Promise or rate, the vessel was ordered into quarantine for fumigation immediately upon arrival at Honolulu this morning.

The Promise comes from Makatea and brings 1102 tons phosphate rock consigned to the Pacific Guano and Fertilizer company. The vessel is being handled through the agency of T. H. Davies and company. The Promise sailed from the French south seas on October 18 and met with fair weather on the way up with the exception of two or three days.

The vessel is expected will be brought to a berth this afternoon or tomorrow morning.

## Kilauea May Resume Kona Run.

The inter-island steamer Kilauea that sailed from San Francisco at two o'clock yesterday afternoon and is due to arrive here on or about November 7 will in all probability resume the Kona and Kau run, relieving the Mauna-Loa which will be employed as an extra steamer. The Kilauea was sent to the coast to be fitted with new bottom plates; damaged some months ago when the vessel ran aground on a Kau reef. It is reported that the Kilauea will return here with about five hundred tons of sand destined for Pearl Harbor.

## Ventura to sail Late Friday Evening.

The Oceanic liner Ventura will be dispatched from San Francisco between ten and ten o'clock tomorrow evening according to an announcement made at the office of C. Brewer & Company, the local representatives of the line. The Ventura is expected to arrive from Australia by the way of Pago Pago early tomorrow morning. The vessel is bringing a considerable quantity of refrigerated produce in departing from Honolulu. The Ventura will carry 20,000 cases of goods.

## Passengers Surprised Authorities.

Immigration authorities were surprised at the number of Asiatic passengers on board the Pacific Mail liner Siberia which arrived at San Francisco on September 30. There were 100 passengers in the storage quarters, of whom were destined for Honolulu. It is said that they were to take passage by the Orient but that shortly after their arrival in Mexico the republic was annexed by the United States and a number of these immigrants were deported by the authorities.

The officers allege that Osborne has issued paper on a local bank calling for the payment of \$70.00. The check being presented developed the painful fact that no funds were on deposit at the financial institution to cover the check.

Osborne claimed that he was an employee of the Pacific Engineering Company but investigation along these lines indicated that he had been with the local concern for but fifteen days. On his person were found letters indicating that the man had applied for employment at Pearl Harbor.

According to cables received in this city, the Canadian Australian liner Marania sailed from Vancouver and Victoria yesterday with destination as Sydney, N. S. W., by way of Honolulu, Suva and Auckland. The vessel is due to arrive here on next Wednesday.

These men insist that Labona is right in his declaration made at police court yesterday morning that he was abused by the skipper of the Guernsey when called to the bridge. The men in the Guernsey insist that they want to see justice done in the case in which Labona is interested.
