### Cable News CHOLERA AND WAR RAGING

[Associated Press Cable]  
SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 17.—Special dispatches from the seat of war assert that the Bulgarian army is concentrating its attack on the Tebatalla lines and that the Turks are making a desperate resistance. A great battle is progressing, as well as negotiations for peace.  
The cholera epidemic is deadly, and it is asserted that an average of one thousand cases are now occurring daily in Constantinople.

JUDGE PERKY NAMED TO SUCCEED HEYBURN  
BOISE, Idaho, Nov. 16.—Governor James H. Hawley has refused the appointment to fill the vacancy in the United States senate caused by the death of Senator Heyburn, and Judge K. I. Perky of Boise has been named to fill out the unexpired term.

### Over-Night FEDERAL Wireless To the Advertiser

Austria and Roumania are preparing to invade Serbia and Bulgaria. Under the agreement with Turkey, the intentions of Austria are said to have been known to the other European powers for the last forty-eight hours.  
Austria has mobilized three army corps within a day's march of Belgrade. Roumania has 65,000 troops ready to sweep down on the unprotected cities of Bulgaria.  
An unverified report from Vienna states that Austria is to be given an important port on the Adriatic and a strip of territory connecting with a port on the Aegean. Roumania is also to be extended at the expense of Bulgaria. The feeling in London tonight is that the serious stage of the Balkan war has just begun.

For twenty years of faithful service as the only woman keeper of a sea coast light, Mrs. E. A. Fisher of Point of Pines, near Pacific Grove, has received the United States efficiency medal and a letter of commendation from the chief of the lighthouse service.

Lieut. George E. Goethals, son of Uncle Sam's chief engineer on the Isthmus, today sailed for Panama on the United Fruit steamer Paoli.  
Lieutenant Goethals is specially detailed on the fortifications work, but the war department has put a seal on the lips of all the engineers engaged on that work.

Miss Mary Bayless, formerly of West Union, has been chosen to fill the social position of private secretary to Mrs. Woodrow Wilson, wife of the President-elect of the United States.

Glenn H. Curtiss' aerial-terra-marine craft, which flies like a bird, skims the water like a fish, and rolls along on land like a ninety-horsepower racing car, was successfully tried out today.  
The new machine has its wheels forward of the center of gravity and is equipped with a tail skid.

Another rich strike of placer gold has been made in the Bay State group opposite claims four and five, below Anvil Creek, Alaska, adjoining the ground on which "pay" was struck a few days ago.

Presumably President-elect Wilson will invite Colonel William Jennings Bryan to become a member of his cabinet, and there is much speculation as to Colonel Bryan's reply to this overture. He has been in Washington a week and no one has been able to get the slightest inkling as to his attitude.

Commander W. H. G. Bullard has been named superintendent to assist in the new wireless station in Arlington, Virginia.  
Orders were issued today for the following officers to report to the aviation school in San Diego on December 1: First Lieut. Samuel H. McCleary, Coast Artillery, and Lewis R. Goodyear, Jr., Coast Artillery.

In connection with the preliminary conference between William Jennings Bryan and Democratic leaders now in the Capital, it has developed that sentiment was greatly in favor of radical reduction of the tariff on foreign import products affecting the cost of living.  
Colonel Bryan and others are said to favor free sugar and the removal of all restrictions on imports from the Philippines contained in the Payne-Aldrich act.
