Its proposed capital stock is \$500,000 in 10,000 shares of \$5 each, with a limit of \$3000 on the amount any stockholder may hold at one time. A member of the committee said this morning that this project was deemed better than a savings and loan association, as in the latter form of organization members were disposed to draw their money too freely and thus keep the funds at a low point. The investment company will deal in real and personal property, and act as agents and brokers for persons, firms and corporations.
