OVER-NIGHT FEDERAL WIRELESS To the Advertiser

President Wilson's statement of attitude of the present administration toward Latin-American affairs was received by the Central and South American diplomats in Washington in the friendly spirit which was voiced in the declaration. It is the understanding among the senate Democrats close to President Wilson and Secretary Bryan that the administration will urge the extension of trade in the southern countries through peaceful means, but that, if necessary, another statement may be issued to indicate more clearly that American interests will not be aided in any way if they take part in attempts to upset established governments. Representative Underwood, leader of the house majority, following a visit to the White House, announced today that President Wilson would issue the call for the extra session of congress within a few days.

Two thousand followers of Carranza, rebel governor of Coahuila, are surrounded in the vicinity of Lampazos Nuevos Leon by four thousand federal troops, according to a statement from the war department today. A decisive engagement is expected within a few hours. It is not known whether Governor Carranza is with his followers. A dozen troop trains left Mexico City for the north this morning. Most of the troops went in the direction of Sonora. The state of Sinaloa, south of Sonora, has revolted officially against Huerta's provisional government, according to reports of persons arriving from Hermosillo. They also report that the Yaqui Indians of Sonora have massed as insurgents.

Rowing men were anxious today for the safety of the boats, which will be used tomorrow when Oxford and Cambridge meet on the Thames for the seventieth "battle" for the Blues. The suffragettes have announced their determination to "get" either the oarsmen or their boats, and although the crews are not greatly alarmed on their own account they are not taking any chances with their frail crafts. The suffragette threat "no votes, no boats and no boat race" was made in a pamphlet circulated a few days ago.

Charging that Mayor Gaynor libelled his father, the late Joseph Pulitzer, in a speech before the South Brooklyn board of trade, Ralph Pulitzer, one of the publishers of the New York World, today demanded that Magistrate Kernochan issue a warrant for Gaynor for alleged criminal libel. "Joseph Pulitzer amassed a fortune of \$50,000,000 by blackmail and indecency," is the statement Ralph Pulitzer alleges Gaynor made before the Brooklyn organization.

John Danies, alleged captain of an arson trust, which has used the torch from San Francisco and Seattle to New York, confessed at Chicago today to Assistant District Attorney Johnson that they had burned at least twenty stores in Chicago as an agent of the arson ring. He said the loss from these stores would reach \$50,000. Danies in his confession implicated a score of business men and insurance adjusters.

A walkout of 75,000 miners in West Virginia is the announced plan at Charleston today of Vice-President Hayes, and other members of the executive board of the United Mine Workers. Hayes declared the strike would be called April 1, unless the strikes in Paint Creek and Cabin Creek districts are settled before that date.
