



TWENTY-FIFTH WILL APPLY FOR LEAGUE ENTRY

[Special Star-Bulletin Correspondence] SCHOFIELD BARRACKS, April 7.—It has been practically decided that the Twenty-fifth Infantry will make formal application for admission to enter the Oahu League at the meeting of the league managers on Wednesday evening. The Twenty-fifth neglected to do so at the last meeting because it was thought that the invitation to join would be forthcoming from the league if it desired the Schofield team in the lineup. In view of the fact that the All-Artillery team seems to be the favorite there is a disheartening minority who think that it will be a waste of time and paper to present the application, but nevertheless the application with such advantageous features as can be offered will doubtless be sent with the hope that the case will be decided on its merits. There are several strong points in favor of the Schofield applicants that cannot fail to appeal to the managers, which would seem to more than counterbalance the claims of the All-Artillery.

There are at this writing two infantry regiments, a regiment of cavalry, a battalion of field artillery with a company of engineers soon to be transferred from Fort De Russy, who comprise nearly the entire mobile army garrison of the islands stationed at this post. Roughly estimated the First Infantry has about nine hundred; the Twenty-fifth infantry about the same, the cavalry about eight hundred and fifty, the artillery six hundred, and the engineers one hundred and fifty; in all about three thousand soldiers. An order was issued last month by the war department to raise the regiments of infantry and cavalry in Hawaii to the maximum authorized strength at once. This means that the infantry companies now numbering sixty-five men will have one hundred and fifty men each, and that both of the infantry regiments here will together have nearly four thousand men.

The post strength will be raised to nearly six thousand. The recruiting for this increase is now going on in the states and the transports for the next three or four months, will be filled with recruits for this post. These men will be stationed here with very limited sources of amusement. It is fair to presume that eighty per cent of these are baseball fans. The problem of furnishing amusement for the large number of colored men now in the islands is a trying one and various kinds of sports is the only solution. They have money to spend and a team that they will support; all that is lacking is the opportunity. If they will fill the stands and overflow the sidelines to see a company contest, what won't they bring to an enterprising ball park management? It is the financial side of this proposition that should appeal to President Chiffingworth and his associates.

The Twenty-fifth not only can carry to town its following from its own ranks, but from all the regiments, for it will be representing Schofield Barracks, the biggest post in the country.

It has been reported that at the last meeting of the league magnates that one of the obstacles to having a team from this post was the fact that there is no noon train from Lilehua on Sunday. Yesterday is the only Sunday since the new train schedule went into effect, and the Twenty-fifth has played in town, that a special train hasn't been necessary. Only the fact that the soldier team had already met and defeated the Japanese and the game scheduled for the afternoon between the First Infantry and the St. Louis teams was to be played here and was the greater attraction, kept a large number of fans at home. Put the Twenty-fifth or any team from the post in a town league and a special train will always be necessary, and secured, for the railroad has an eye to business and with an increased garrison the train will go back on the regular schedule. Arrangements can doubtless be made with the post exchanges for both the tickets for the grounds and the railroad fares, so any soldier at any time of the month can have the price.

Another point raised is the maneuvers and practice marches may extend over Sunday and thus keep both fans and team away from town. It is only very rarely, if ever, that this would occur, and never would work of any character be done on Sunday and should troops be absent from the post the distances on Oahu would never prevent troops going to town, nor are the conditions apt to be such that permission to attend would be denied them.

As to which team can draw the greater crowd of Honolulu fans, this cannot be discussed, for the Twenty-fifth and the All Artillery have not met and comparative scores are never conclusive, but it is certain that the team from this post can increase the number very considerably.

LATTER DAY SAINTS OBSERVE ANNIVERSARY

In celebration of its eighty-third anniversary, the church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints held special services yesterday, the occasion being observed by the two local branches of that denomination.

The church was first founded by Joseph Smith and five of his followers at Fayette, New York, on April 6, 1830. In its laws the church embodied temperance, social purity, obedience, civil law and spiritual development. Following the death of Joseph Smith, who was killed by a mob at Carthage in 1844, disruption commenced in the church and various leaders arose. Brigham Young, one of the strongest and emigrated to Utah. The church then took the name of the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. Besides being the eighty-third anniversary of the founding of the church yesterday was also the fifty-third anniversary of the leadership of Joseph Smith of Missouri, who visited Honolulu in 1907 and while here dedicated the church on King street near Thomas square. Joseph F. Smith of Utah visited Honolulu many times, coming here for the first time as a missionary. Both the Utah Mormons and the Reorganized Church are largely represented in the islands.

WON'T CHANGE NAME OF SCHOFIELD BARRACKS

The name of Schofield Barracks will not be changed to "Lilehua Post," but one of the fortifications connected with the land defense at Pearl Harbor may be given the last-mentioned cognomen. Such is the statement received from Secretary of War Lindley M. Garrison, in response to the concurrent resolution sent him by the territorial legislature, asking that the name of Schofield Barracks be changed. He states that it is customary to fit to new fortifications the titles of distinguished soldiers, sailors or statesmen, but that the resolution sent him by the legislature will be further considered when the construction of the additional fortifications at Pearl Harbor are under way.
