Governor's estimate increases 1915 period 23.97 per cent or \$72,657.43 To raise the estimated amount of \$4,513,323.58 on the tax valuation for 1912 of \$168,993,172.00 would require an average rate of \$1,353+ per \$100. The average rate for 1913 is \$1.14, hence an increase in rate of .213 per \$100, or over 1/5 of 1 per cent. To raise \$4,513,323.58 in the two year period or \$2,256,661.72 in one year at the average rate, for 1913, or \$1.14 per \$100, would necessitate an increase in valuation over 1912 of \$168,993,172.00 to \$197,952,788.00. For further comparison note that the assessed valuation for 1911 was \$150,598,136.00, or a proposed increase in two years of \$47,354,652.00.
