

Section 1 of this Act shall, upon conviction, be punished by imprisonment for a term of not more than two years, or by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

ACT 126 AN ACT

TO AMEND CHAPTER 154 OF THE REVISED LAWS OF HAWAII, RELATING TO REGISTRATION OF LAND TITLES.

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Hawaii:

SECTION 1. Section 2412 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii as amended by Section 2, Act 43, of the Session Laws of 1907, is hereby amended so that the same shall read as follows:

"Section 2412. Application, by whom made. The owner of any estate or interest in land may apply to have his title registered."

SECTION 2. Section 2414 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii is hereby amended by striking out in lines 6 and 7 the words "whether an absolute, a qualified or possessory title is required" and inserting in place thereof the following words: "the estate or interest of the applicant in said land."

SECTION 3. Section 2441 of the Revised Laws of Hawaii is hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

ACT 127 AN ACT

TO AMEND SECTION 17 OF ACT 89 OF THE LAWS OF 1913 CREATING A PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION AND DEFINING ITS POWERS AND DUTIES.

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Hawaii:

SECTION 1. Section 17 of Act 89 of the Laws of 1913 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 17. Finances. All salaries, wages and expenses, including travelling expenses, of the commission, each commissioner and its officers, assistants and employees, incurred in the performance or exercise of the powers or duties required or conferred by this Act, may be paid out of any appropriation available for the purpose. Section 1889 of the Revised Laws shall apply to said commission and each commissioner, as well as to the supreme and circuit courts and the justices and judges thereof, and all costs and fees paid or collected hereunder shall be deposited in the treasury of the Territory to the credit of a special fund to be called the 'Public Utilities Commission Fund' which is hereby created for the purpose. There shall also be paid to the commission in each of the months of March and September in each year by each public utility which is subject to investigation by the commission a fee which shall be equal to one-twentieth of one per cent of the gross income from the public utility business carried on by such public utility in this Territory during the preceding year, plus one-fiftieth of one per cent of the par value of the stock issued by such public utility and outstanding on December 31 of the preceding year, if its principal business is that of performing public utility services in this Territory. Such fee shall likewise be deposited in the treasury to the credit of said fund. The moneys in said fund are hereby appropriated for the payment of all salaries, wages and expenses authorized or prescribed by this Act."

SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

ACT 128 AN ACT

TO AMEND SECTION 11 OF ACT 100 OF THE LAWS OF 1905, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 1 OF ACT 114 OF THE LAWS OF 1907, RELATING TO THE PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS ON OFFICIAL BONDS.

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Hawaii:

SECTION 1. Section 11 of Act 100 of the Laws of 1905, as amended by Section 1 of Act 114 of the Laws of 1907, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11. When any corporation as hereinbefore designated shall be surety on any official bond required or authorized by this Act, the premium due such corporation for acting as such surety, and all stamps required by law to be paid thereon, shall be paid by the Territory; provided that such stamps and premiums on official bonds of license commissioners, circuit or district court officers, and all other officers whose ex-

penditures are paid by the city and county or the several counties, shall be deemed to be included in such expenditures and shall be paid by the city and county and the several counties."

SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

ACT 129 AN ACT

TO AMEND SUBDIVISION D OF SECTION 74 OF ACT 39 OF THE SESSION LAWS OF 1905, BEING "AN ACT CREATING COUNTIES WITHIN THE TERRITORY OF HAWAII AND PROVIDING FOR THE GOVERNMENT THEREOF."

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Hawaii:

SECTION 1. Subdivision D of Section 74 of Act 39 of the Session Laws of 1905, being "An Act Creating Counties within the Territory of Hawaii and Providing for the Government thereof", is hereby amended by deleting the semicolon (;) at the end thereof, and adding thereto the following "and shall deliver a copy thereof to the treasurer."

SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

ACT 130 AN ACT

TO AUTHORIZE THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO CONTRACT WITH THE LORD-YOUNG ENGINEERING COMPANY, LIMITED, FOR THE FILLING IN OF CERTAIN INSANITARY LANDS IN HONOLULU.

WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Public Works, on May 23, 1912, pursuant to law, entered into a contract with the Lord-Young Engineering Company, Limited, to fill in certain insanitary lands at Kewalo and vicinity, described in said contract, to the estimated amount of 362,500 cubic yards at the rate of 42 cents per cubic yard, and

WHEREAS, after said contract had been entered into, certain of the owners or occupants of the lands covered by the contract filed in their lands, and certain others are desirous of doing the same, and

WHEREAS, the Grade Commission of the City and County of Honolulu is now desirous of reducing the grade in said locality; the total reduction in the amount of fill due to the filling in by the land-owners and to the lowering of the grade being estimated at 50,000 cubic yards:

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Hawaii:

SECTION 1. The Superintendent of Public Works is hereby authorized to contract, without calling for tenders, with the Lord-Young Engineering Company, Limited, for the filling in of other insanitary lands in an amount not exceeding the estimated reduction that may be caused in the fill under said contract of May 23, 1912, either by acts of the land-owners or occupants or by the Grade Commission. Said filling shall be done in Honolulu and, if practicable, on land adjoining or near the land covered by the present contract, and at a price not exceeding 42 cents per cubic yard, and shall be, as far as practicable, of material similar to or as good as that specified in the present contract with Lord-Young Engineering Company, Limited. Said fill shall be deemed to be in substitution for an equal amount under said contract and to be in all respects in fulfillment of said contract to that extent.

SECTION 2. Upon the making of the contract herein provided for, the Superintendent of Public Works shall notify the Auditor thereof, and the Auditor shall then endorse upon both the present contract and the one herein provided for his certificate that he has transferred from the account of the former contract to that of the latter, the amount called for by the latter.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
